

# Anderson scores five to lead Norval victory

Norval, with Doug Anderson going on a scoring rampage, drew first blood in the Georgetown Industrial Hockey League final with a 6-3 victory over Philp Publishing.

The next game in the series will be played tomorrow night with an 8 pm start. The series will then resume on its regular Sunday date with a 9:15 starter. The team that gets six points first will win the championship.

### ONE-MAN SHOW

All season Anderson has taken a back seat to teammates of the likes of Brian Beaumont and Dave Holmes when it came to scoring. However, Anderson was a one-man show in the first game as he tallied five of his teams' six goals.

It was the first time Norval had hit the ice in over two

weeks, but they picked up where they left off in the semi-final against Way-Jay.

Philp, on the other hand, had a very tough semi-final against the Caledon Chiefs. That series went five games.

However, if Norval was stable, it did not show. It took Anderson, who did not get any goals in the three semi-final games, only 14 seconds of the first period to put his club on the board first. Ray Inglis and Dave Holmes assisted on the play.

Philp settled down and at the 2:06 mark of the period Bert Osborne tied the score with Ron Blizzard and Bob Robson setting him up.

Beaumont then converted on a play set up by linemates Ian Syme and Charlie Knoepfli and at 4:40 Norval had the lead again.

Only 31 seconds later Nick

Belviso scored from Bob Riley and Roger Chapman to tie the score once again for Philp.

After the amazing start it appeared both teams were going to hit double figures, but things settled down and there were no more goals in the first period.

In fact it was not until the 14:54 mark of the second period that Anderson put Norval in front for the third time in the game. Bill Kirby was the playmaker.

Philp counter-punched for the third time in the game as approximately four minutes later Blizzard tallied from Bob Osborne.

### MOMENTUM

The teams went into the third period tied at three with Blizzard's late marker apparently giving his club the momentum.

However, in the third period Anderson and his mates went to work to give the favored Norval the win.

Anderson scored the winner midway through the frame after taking a pass from Holmes.

Late in the game Philp took a few unnecessary penalties and Norval made them pay the full price for them.

With less than a half minute remaining on the clock Anderson scored his fourth with Beaumont and Ray Inglis the playmakers.

Then with just five seconds to go Anderson reached the five-goal plateau with Beaumont again the playmaker.

Norval is definitely the favorite to repeat as champions, but Philp has the talent to give them a very good battle before it is all over.
