Interest shown in co-operative nursery school

.Acton residents will be holding their second meeting in less than a month on May 3 to discuss the community's need for a co-operative nursery school.

 A meeting held last week at the Acton library to discuss the issue resulted in numerous interested phone calls to the Acton Community Services Centre according to director Terry Grubbe.

"We felt the number of calls we get indicated there was a need for some type of day care facility". Mrs. Grubbe said, "so we set up a meeting and turned it over to the public to discuss and reach a decision about it. That's our function. To see a need and take it to the public for action on it if they feel it's necessary".

NURSERY EASIER Mrs. Grubbe said the suggestion was for a co-operative nursery rather than a regional day care centre since the nursery would be easier to get

Wendy McKee, president of the Shoreline Council to which all the co-operative nursery schools in Halton belong, outlined benefits parents will receive from their participation in a co-operative school which would not be theirs if their children attended a conventio-

parents dropped them off at a specific hour and picked them up as scheduled.

Marsha Beaver, director of the Milton Co-operative nursery school, gave details on requirements for staffing a co-operative. The school's director must have at least a

degree in early childhood education and one staff member is required for every five to six youngsters in the nursery.

Since a parent is considered equivalent to half a staff member a good number of parents can be involved in such a venture, she said.

USE CLASSROOMS Mrs. Grubbe said that the possibility exists of using an empty classroom in one of the public schools for the nursery. This would be ideal, she said. since it would meet government standards for such things

as hee safety. It would also make a nice transition for the youngsters once they were ready to enter kindergarten if they had already attended nursery school in the building.

Further discussion of such

matters as fund-raising fee scales and the formation of a hoard of directors will take place May 3 at the Acton library when other rescurce people will be present to answer the group's questions on forming a co-operative nurs-

New psychiatric program approved

Three new health care projects, including a psychiatric treatment program for north Halton, have been approved by Halton regional council for implementation this year.

The provincial ministry of health offered last week to finance the new programs and subsidize salaries for administrative staff, thus resolving a concern that had become the chief obstacle facing approval of the programs.

As well as the daytime psychiatric treatment program planned for north Halton, approval was granted for a behavioral training program for young children and a community pediatric program for handicapped children.

town and Milton. Staff Inspector Terrell has taken over the position from Acting Superintendent Roy Taylor, who is now in charge of District 2, which is Oakville. These appointments are part of a re-organizing process following the Ontario Police Commission report on the Halton

Stan Raike, an advisor from the Ontario Police Commission, who is assisting the force with its re-organization, said the report is not being implemented as is.

"I've looked at the report, and I'm trying to reconcile it with local conditions and circumstances," he said.

made is the appointment of an officer with the rank of staff inspector as a district com-

mander. In the past, this posit-

ion has been held by an officer

with the rank of superintend-

ent. Mr. Raike said the force is

looking now at designating the

job by function and not by

rank. Staff Inspector Terrell has been a police officer for 29 years, starting with the OPP January 1, 1950. He left thie OPP in 1954 to join the former Trafalgar Township police force, which amalgamated with the Oakville police force in 1962. Oakville became part

of the regional force in 1974. Staff Inspector Terrell is married, with three grown children. He and his wife live in Oakville, and he has no immediate plans to move closer to the Georgetown




