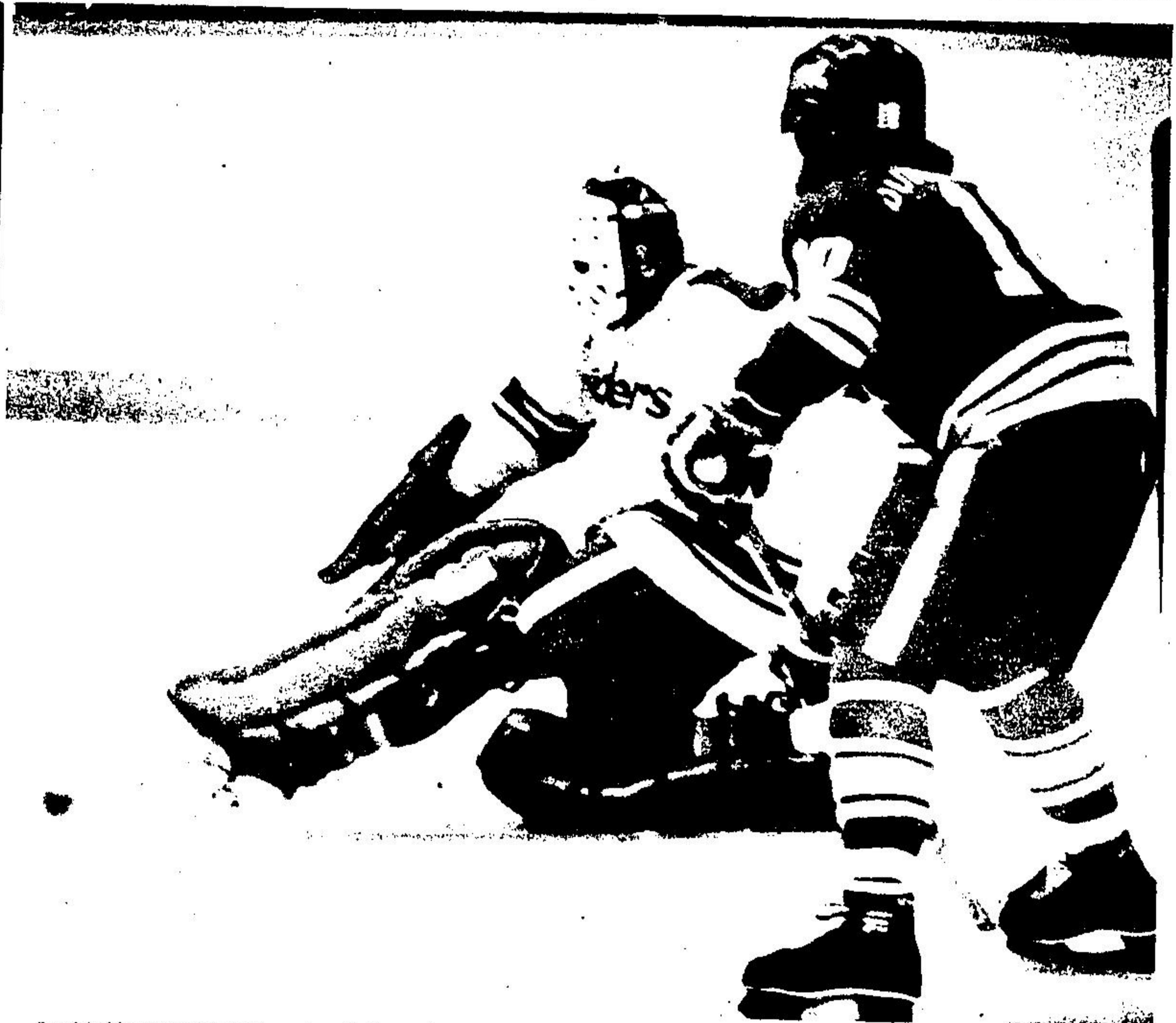

Raiders champions

The Georgetown Raiders regained the OHA Intermediate "A" title Saturday night as their 7-4 win at Alcot Arena gave them the league title four games to two over the northern division's Port Elgin Sunocos.

The Raiders won their eighth league title in 1976-77, but last year they were defeated in the final by the Dundas Merchants.

"We really pulled ourselves together for this game," said coach Gerry Inglis. "Everybody in the lineup

played well." Only a few of the Raiders had played even close to par in the two losses in the fourth and fifth games in Port Elgin.

BIG GUYS

"Our big guys played particularly well in this game when a good effort was needed from them most," said Inglis.

Georgetown was led by their biggest guns, Ray Tonelli, Colin Gordon, Juri Kudrasovs and Peter Sturgeon.

"Juri played his best game

since we entered the playoffs", the coach said.

It did not take long for the Raiders to get on the board as Tonelli tallied only 1:10 into the period with his team enjoying a five to four manpower advantage. Archie Chase, who turned in another tenacious effort, set up the goal.

The Sunocos did not take long to get that goal back as 41 seconds later Claude Foy, banged one in.

According to Sunoco coach Al Blair the biggest goal of

the game was the next one which went to Gordon. It came while the Raiders were shorthanded.

"That goal really hurt us," said Blair. "We were starting to come on before it was scored".

Kudrasovs and Sturgeon earned the assists on the marker. Sturgeon was again playing the blueline as Ron Fogal missed the game.

Three minutes later the Sunocos tied the game for a

second time with captain Buckton tallying.

SECOND PERIOD

"In all their wins it was the second period that did us," said Blair. "We've had weak second periods throughout the year. . . I keep telling them, but we just can't seem to play good hockey in the second period".

It was no different in the sixth game of the series as the Raiders scored their remaining five goals and for all
