Another vote for new town library

To the editor of The Herald: I am writing this letter to you from two points of view: as a parent of two pre-school children and as a former guidance counsellor in a secondary school. My husband and I have lived in the town of Halton Hills for six years. During this time, I have followed the library controversy with concern and frustration. As a former guidance

counsellor, I am acutely aware of the lack of facilities in our community for our children, and particularly, our teenagers. We now have three cinemas which were greeted with enthusiasm. However, I would question their cultural value and their lasting effect on the mental and physical growth of our children. The library, in contrast, could and would be a place

which children of all ages are encouraged to visit. I am most definitely in favour of a combined library and cultural centre which children, adults and senior citizens can call their own. Georgetown requires a focus and a uniqueness which will draw people to it, rather than force people to rely on the resources of neighboring communities. Georgetown requires forward thinking planners who are willing to do something "right", rather than settle on second best. I, for one, would agree to an increase in my tax dollar in order to support a combined library and cultural centre in a location which will allow for accessibility to all, parking, and future expansion. Such a centre would involve all our citizens in a lasting and positive cultural experience which is now seriously diluted in the scattered and inadequate facilities provided.

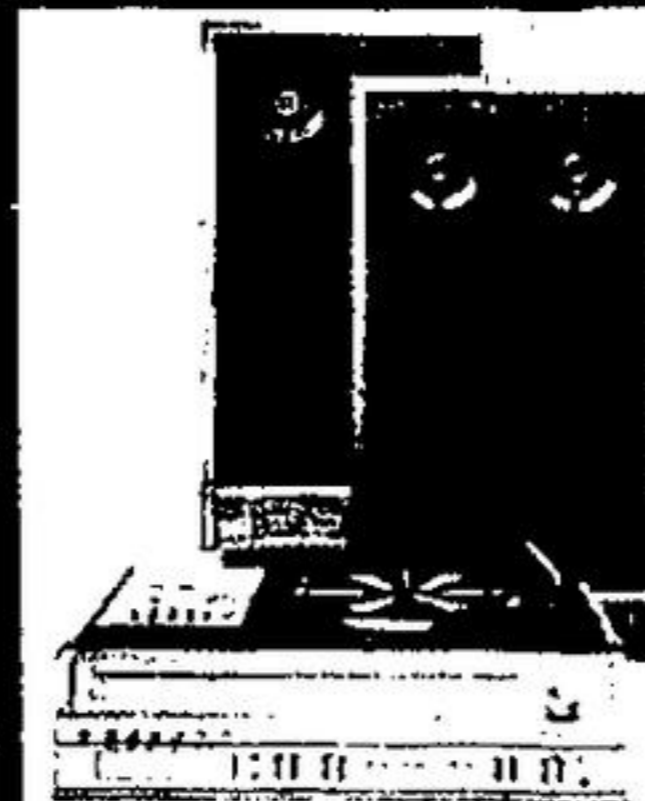

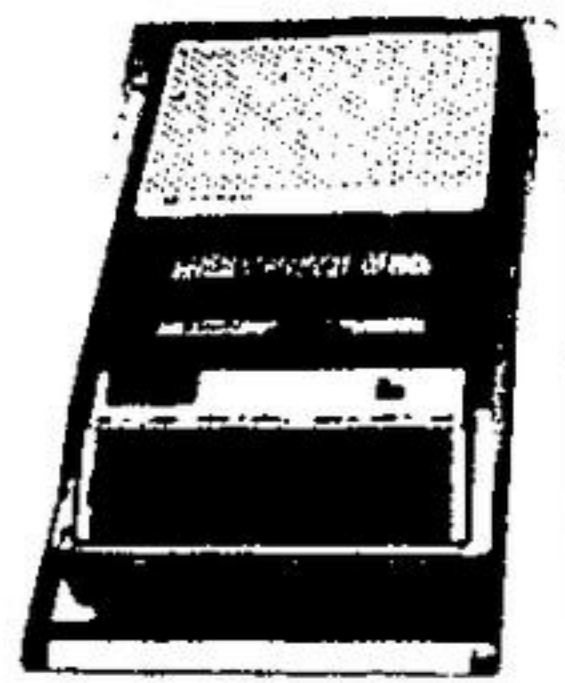
