

# Philps comes back to take crown

Philp Publishing pulled off an amazing comeback which culminated with a 5-0 victory Monday giving them the Georgetown Industrial Hockey League title over Norval.

Norval once led in the series two games to none, but Philp stormed back to take wins in the next three.

In all fairness to Norval they had to play the latter part of the series without

Brian Beaumont, their best forward, who went out with a dislocated shoulder, and Ray Inglis, their best defenseman who suffered a broken leg.

Philp forced a fifth and deciding game by taking 6-5 and 6-2 victories in games three and four also played last week.

### TIRED

However, without their big guns in the lineup, and also

an overall shortage of manpower, Norval noticeably faded at the end of the three Philp wins. It was obvious that if Norval was to win they would have to accumulate a big lead early and hold on.

In the 6-5 Philp win, Norval led 4-3 after two periods, but they could not hold off Philp in the third.

The leaders of the Philp comeback were Bert Osborne

and Bob Osborne. The two small, but tough forwards, scored two goals each in the team's first win. The other goals went to Kevin Brown and Nick Belviso.

Doug Anderson, who has had an excellent playoff series, led the Norval attack as he pocketed three goals. The other two markers went to Charlie Knoepfli.

The Osborne boys again

led Philp to victory in game four to tie up the series.

### HOTNETMINDER

This time netminder Ron Osborne also got in on the act as he made a few good saves early when the Norval legs were still fresh.

Norval had lost another player for this game. Bill Kirby, the rugged defense man, had thrown a fit late in the third game and it cost him a game's suspension.

Six different shooters fired goals home for Philp. The scorers were Bob Osborne, Roger Chapman, Nick Belviso, Bert Osborne, John Quackenbush and Kevin Brown. Bob Osborne set up four of the goals.

Philp was also without a big shooter in this game as Ron Blizzard received a suspension for a high sticking infraction the previous outing.

There was no love lost between the two teams as it came time to play the fifth and deciding game Monday night. However, the main priority of both clubs was to cop the crown so they stuck to hockey in the early going.

The game was scoreless in the first period with Osborne and his counterpart at the other end Rick Tomkinson

both very sharp.

### SAME STORY

It was much the same story in the second period as the two teams played it tight to the vest. The turning point in the game may have come midway through the period when Tomkinson was shaken up. It took a long delay before Tomkinson was ready to re-enter the net. He did not have much work the rest of the way and the score remained scoreless.

However, Philp, with a full bench was fresh in the third and they completely controlled the period.

Two goals by Bob Osborne and one by Nick Belviso gave them a three-goal lead before the period was half over.

After Philp took the big lead frustrated Norval players, who felt the officiating had been unfair, began to take runs at Philp skaters. After two more goals, by Bert Osborne and D'Orzio things turned ugly, but luckily sanity prevailed and the game was able to be finished.

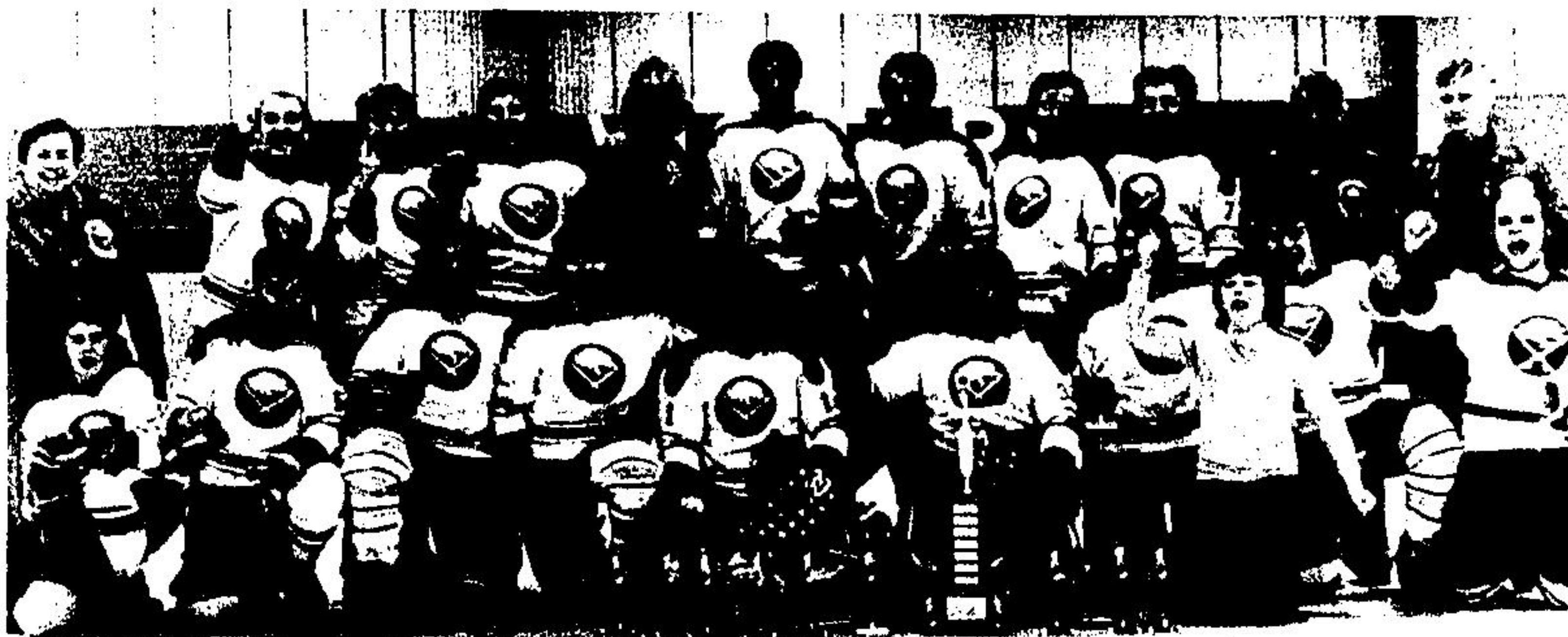
Norval, a very proud team, took the defeat hard as they had only lost one game before the final series began.
