OPENING STORE

Miracle Mart will be opening their Halton Hills store on May 29. Due to the official opening being close to the Athlete of the Year dinner, this year and this year only, the Builder of the Year will be announced and honored as part of the ceremonies of the opening.

Next year and the years following the Athlete of the Year, who will win the Royal Bank Trophy; and the Sports Builder will both be announced at the same dinner.

The creation of the Builder of the Year, which will go to a non-athlete, actually was talked about by the committee which selected the Athlete of the Year last year.

The ballot for the Sports Builder appears elsewhere in the newspaper. Nominations will only be received until May 14, so do not hesitate in filling one out and delivering or mailing it to The Herald.

Only people, or groups, who are nominated will be considered for the award. A winners and two runner-ups will be selected from the nominees.


