Ball hockey begins May 13

The Georgetown Ball Hockey Association will begin play May 13, said league president Doug Pemberton. Originally the league was to begin on May 6, this coming Sunday.

Pemberton said as of now there will be six teams in the league. He said there is still time to add two more teams but interested parties must act now.

The May 13 games, which will count in the league standings, will be played in Brampton, with the season getting underway at Georgetown Memorial Arena on May 15.

Pemberton said there is a good possibility that there will be a booster club set up

at the Lion's Hall, situated behind Memorial, after Thursday night games. The teams will see action on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays.

The Brampton league, which the Georgetown league is affiliated with, has pub nights after their Sunday night games.

If the league is successful in getting a permit to have a booster club, then Pemberton said there will be video tapes of games played that evening for the players to view.

There are still some openings for players in the Georgetown Summer Hockey League. However, interested players are urged to sign up soon as registration

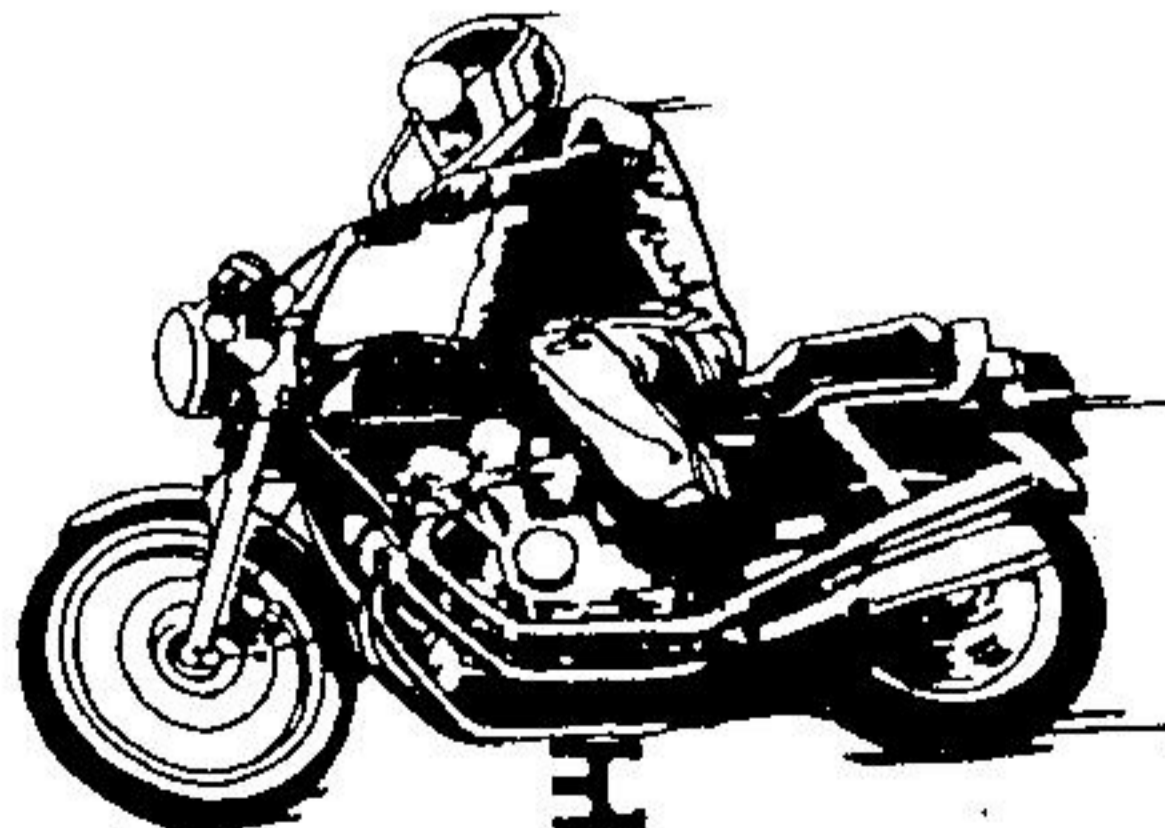
is expected to close soon.
