Badminton players go to OFSAA

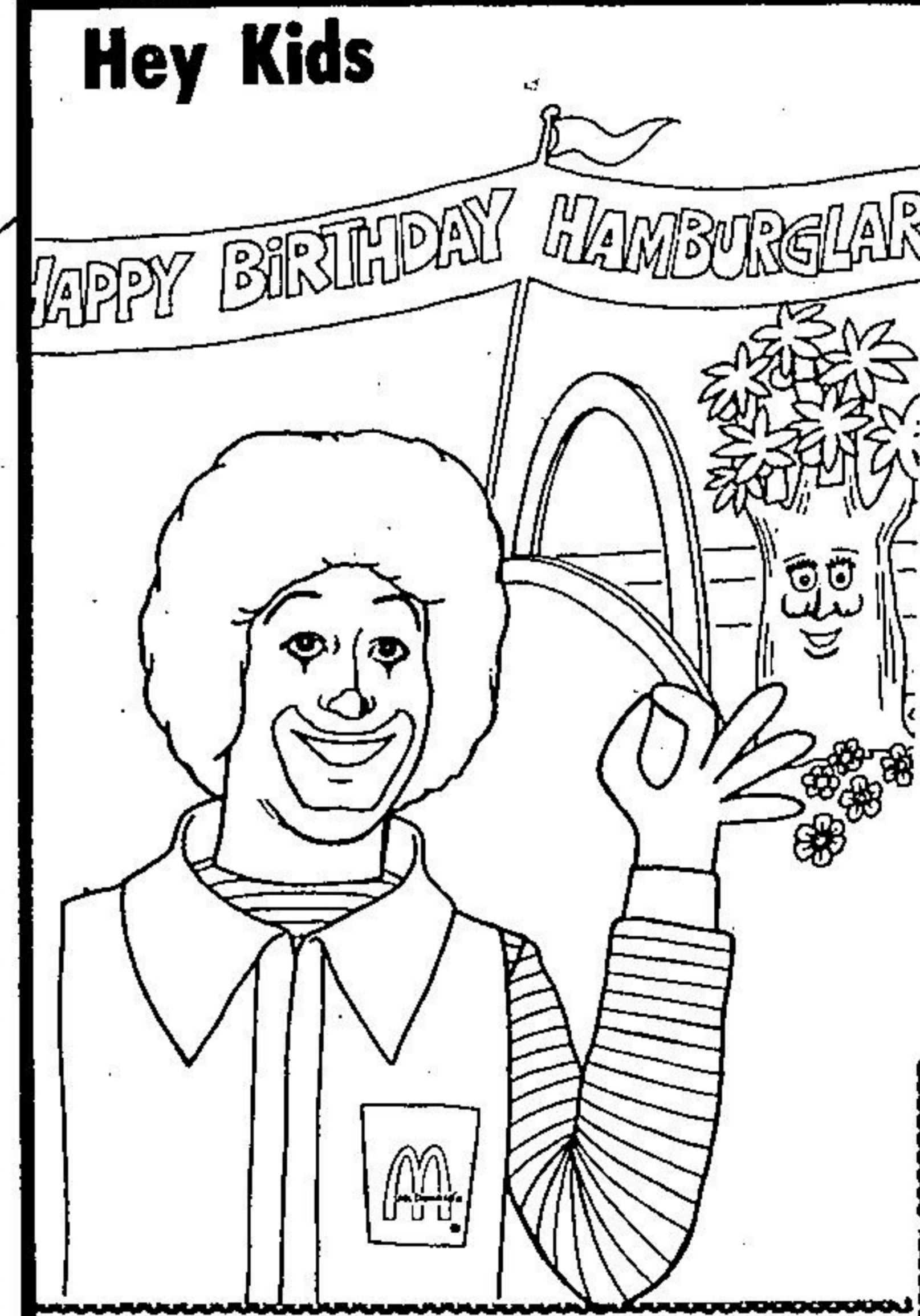
