pitching in to help out.

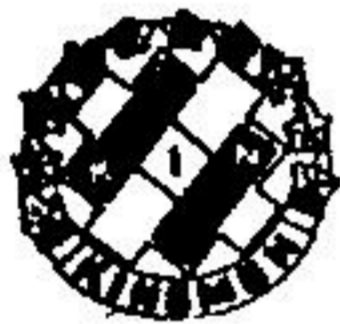
Kentner said souvenir programs will be printed for the hockey matches and there will also be other forms of memorabilia given to the Swedes.
