## Industrial league begins play schedule now has 27 games

Play got underway in the Georgetown Industrial Fastball League Monday after the games scheduled for the Sunday season openers were rained out.

There are 10 teams in the league this year with each of them scheduled to play 27 games.

League president Bryan Lewis said that the schedule was reduced from the 33 played last year so that the regular season would be over earlier.

Last year the playoffs did

not get underway until September and the rain and cold weather caused more than a few problems.

This year the playoffs could get underway as early as July 24 with eight of the 10 teams qualifying for them.

In case of tied games this year there will be one extra inning played. If it is still tied after that inning each club will be awarded a point.

### ALL-STAR

The all-star game, a classic last year, is scheduled to be played on July 22, a Sunday afternoon.

Lewis said the league will continue to crack down on profanity, rough play and abuse of officials.

"The league has reached a point where it has become fun to play and there is keen competition in most games," Lewis said. "As in past years, profanity, rough play and abuse of officials will not be tolerated and we urge players who do it to find another form of exercise."

Only players who compete in six regular season games will be eligible for the playoffs, Lewis said.

The bulk of the action this year will be on the Georgetown Fairground's Diamond C. There will be 60 games played on it. Forty-five games will be played on Diamond B, 19 at Hornby and 11 at Acton.
