

GDHS football program may fold if helmets unsafe

The fate of the GDHS Rebel football team is still up in the air until tests being conducted at Waterloo University on the football helmets are completed.

According to GDHS head of physical education Fred Kotani, tests are being done on several schools' football helmets to see if they are safe enough to use.

Football over the years has been a growing concern to many because of the injuries. The Rebels do have 12

helmets that are safety approved, however they need approximately 30 helmets to complete a team roster.

It all boils down to the Rebels playing this year or not playing.

The problem that faces the junior and senior squads is that if the helmets are found to be unsafe then it is possible that football will be cancelled because there is not enough money to buy 18 new helmets plus an additional 30 for the junior team. Results from Waterloo

have been delayed because the machine they are using broke down, but according to Kotani they should hear early this week.

At the last meeting of Halton Board of Education a request to the executive committee for \$25,000 to \$30,000 for new helmets for area schools was denied.

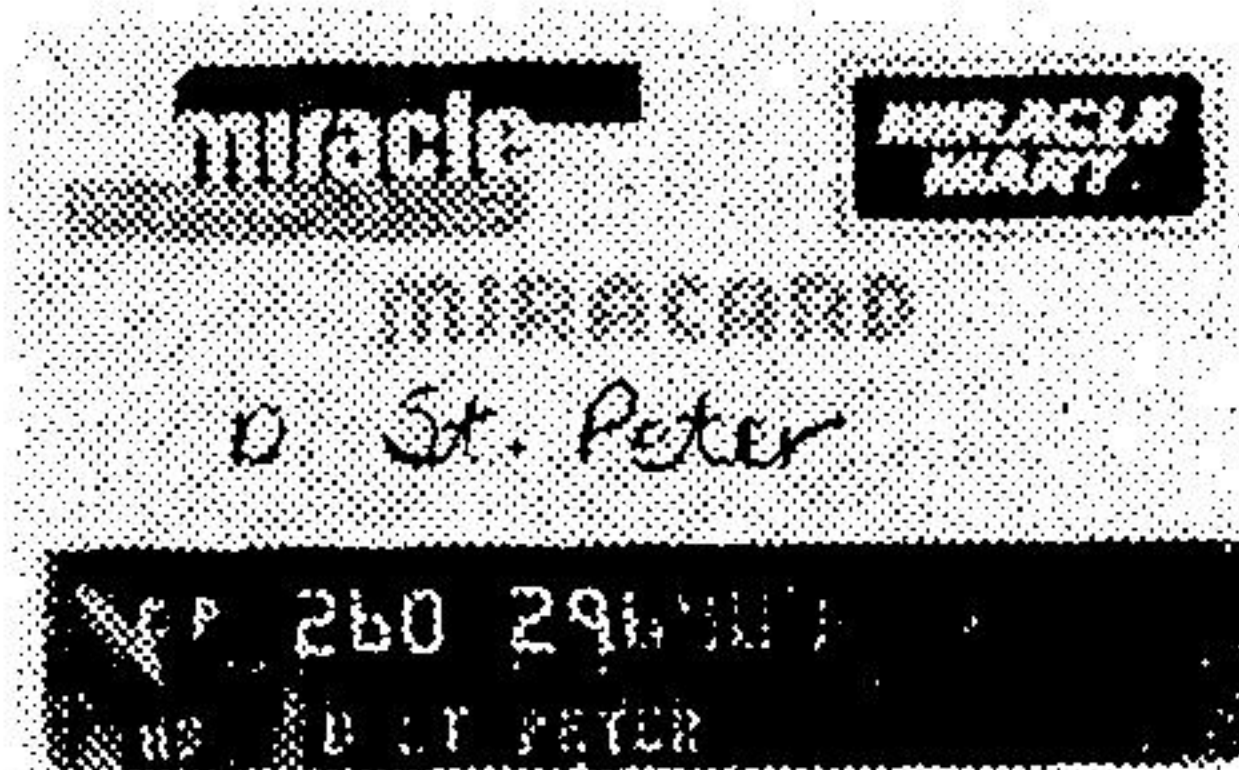
