

Christine Kogon makes memorable debut

Christine Kogon made a memorable debut in the men's Toronto and District Squash League winning her first match by an impressive 3-1 score.

Kogon is the first woman squash player at the Georgetown Racquet Club to compete in the men's league and although her "D" lost three matches to two to Credit Valley she beat her male opponent.

Kogon earned a spot on the "D" of the club by climbing the ladder for Georgetown players and against Credit Valley she played in the number three position.

Dave McEwen won the other match for Georgetown taking a 3-2 decision. Barry Griffiths and Monty Hyde lost 1-3 and Doug Farrugan was on the short end of a 2-3 score.

It was the first week for the summer league and the other Georgetown teams both came out winners.

The "B" team defeated Mississauga Racquet Club four matches to one. Al Kogon won 3-0, Rod Eastwood and Rod Presswood and Boyd Hoddinott were all

3-1 winners. Norm Hertz lost his match 1 0-4 0-3.

The "C" team won three matches to two against Oak-

and Kay Steele lost 1-3 and Barry Griffiths 0-3.
