Last year Hall was one of the coaches of the Canadian National Schoolboy Wrestling team and also its chief organizer.

The practices for the team were held at Centennial and the qualifying meet at the Georgetown district high school.

The Canadian team went on to represent Canada excellently at the World Championships in Alberquerque, New Mexico.

Hall will again be one of the coaches of the Canadian Schoolboy team in 1979, This year the team's headquarters will be St. Catharines.

A highlight in Hall's career will take place in the very near future when he travels to Moscow in the Soviet Union to study that country's wrestling program.

The Centennial teacher is one of the 15 coaches across Canada selected to make the jaunt.

LEVY

Levy has been the chairman of the Georgetown International Bantam tournament for the past 14 years.

Levy, who is also a Halton Hills councillors, first got involved with the tournament as a member of the Kinsmen Club. His involvement at first was to organize entertainment for the participants when they were off the ice.

In the sixth year of the

tournament Levy took over as chairman and he has held that post ever since. This was scheduled to be Levy's last year at the helm as next year the Lion's Club is slated to take over the running of the show. However, Levy will stay on as consultant for the

tournament.
