## Fishing great in Fairy Lake

Pike fishing has been great in Fairy Lake in Acton. Lots of fish and many good size ones at that have been taken. The reason that I mention it is that it is a close location to fish and has everything that the northern lakes have. Catch and release is still a good policy as the Ministry of Natural Resources does not and will not stock the lake. News of the long weekend will be in next week's column, as my deadline was last Friday due to the hollday and the election news. I have been asked many times why I have not included political issues in this column. The main reason is that I must represent all manor of people and policies. I make my living as a real estate sales person with Royal Trust and am very much in the public eye with my many and varied public contacts. With this in mind I try to release information as it comes to me and it is not always the view or the opinion of the writer.

Lazy Ike Corporation puts out a great line of lures, and has for a long time. The Natural Tike is a 11/2 inch body with a diving lip. I have been using the Bluegill and Crappie models and find them terrific for Bass and Walleye. The larger model is the Natural Ike. The Natural lke comes with a medium diver or deep diver lip and work for a variety of fishing conditions. A look at the line of Lazy Ike lures will show a fine assortment of colours and sizes, with various depths of presentation.

Last week I spoke to the Georgetown Fireflies Camping Club, and got into a little friendly bantering on the proper names of game fish. As my regular readers know, I am a stickler for the proper identification of our fish. One of the reasons is it helps to prevent confusion when it comes to our game and fish laws. Of course the fish in question was the WALLEYE, that is so often called the PICKERAL. This fish has so many names that it must be called by its official name. The statement was made that it is an "AMERICAN" name for one of "OUR" fish. This is not true as the Walleye is native to a great many waters and the name Walleye is universal. It has been designated as the official name for the "Yellow Pickeral" or "Pike Perch" or "Dore" or "Golden perch" or a great many other names including "Yellow Salmon". Let's just call this fabulous fish a Walleye and be done with it. That way we know for certain that the season is opened or closed and how many to take home. By the way, the Fireflies is a great club and if you are interested in camping, especially "family camping", then give me a call and I will make contact for you with the membership chairperson.

With the emphasis on the outdoors now that the warm weather is here, how about doing a little study on some of our widlife. The GREAT BLUE HERON is another of our multi-named species. Often erroneously called a Crane, the Heron family is varied in size and colour. One of the most common in our region is the Great Blue Heron. A good bird book from the library or the local book shop will help in idenficition.

The National body that oversees our wildlife is the Canadian Wildlife Service under the umbrella of the Ministry of the Environment and they have a good range of material available. A letter to the CWS, Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0E7 will get a list of publications that should help you

to better enjoy our wildlife.

The Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters is having some financial difficulties. 


