

Following a lengthy but apparently unavoidable delay. Halton region has finally decided against purchasing domiciliary care services from the new Acton senior citizens

residence. The region's health and social services committee las. week recommended against the purchase, noting that the region already has service agreements with seniors' residences in Acton and Burlington.

"Those two residences are able to accommodate the number of people applying for assistance at the present time," health and social services administrator Rennie Vivian told the committee. "Nineteen people are currently being assisted

financially." Mr. Vivian explained that his parent illness which forced a lengthy absence from his duties, resulted in a substantial delay between the time he was first contacted about the possibility of purchasing services from the new Acton residence and the time he was able to evaluate the

Mr. Vivian suggested that, in future, the region may further consider purchasing services from a variety of senior residences which will gradually increase in number "so that patients can be placed as close to their homes possible." At that time, he said, the region may wish to enter into agreements for the provision of accommodations.

## Additional funding sought for staff

The Hatton board of education is seeking additional funding from the ministries of health and community and social services for the use of non-educational personnel such as social workers in special education programs.
