# Legion Royalettes begin, Dean Popiel testifies

Taken from the May 25, 1977 issue of The Herald:

The Georgetown Legion Royalettes, 1976 PWSA Juvenile "A" Champions, made their debut with two games last week in the Junior Ladies League.

The Royalettes were not too successful as they were defeated 2-3 by Grimsby and 2-12 by Oakville.

Junior games are nine innings in length, as opposed to the seven innings played in Juvenile, and the Royalettes' lack of staying power was the main contributor to the defeats.

Bright spots for the Royalettes in the two games were provided by a few newcomers. Noreen Atkinson, Moni-

ca Pollock and Mary Caruso are all midget-age players and they performed excellently in their first exposure to junior play.

Taken from the May 29, 1974 Herald:

Dean Popiel, a 16-year old from Georgetown, told a government inquiry Monday his vision remains hampered six weeks after an injury in a hockey fight.

"I still have a little problem," said the Bramalea blues' player, who battled a Junior B opponent from Hamilton in a fight-filled game. After the brawl the Blues' coach resigned and team president Rick Hay withdrew from the playoff series.

Two days after the Popiel testimony the provincial government announced Toronto lawyer Bill McMurtry's appointment to investigate the events leading up to the Bramalea forfeit and the resulting suspension levelled by the Ontario Hockey Association.

Taken from the May 29, 1969 issue of the Herald:

Georgetown Giants, who have still to be outit in a ball game after three starts went down to their second straight defeat in the Halton Intermediate Baseball League 5-3 at the hands of Campbellville. Giants had 12 hits to 10 by the Merchants.

Bernie Dore, who was relieved in the eighth by Rick Maloney, took the loss for the Giants.

Giants did not score until the sixth when Jim James, John Collins and Chico Ciaschi hit safely to produce one run. In the ninth, hits by Jim McGill, Phil Marzo, Roy Shultis and James pushed over the Giants' other two runs.

Taken from the May 27, 1959 issue of the Herald:

Two teams went from the Legion branch in Georgetown to play in a dart tournament sponsored by Labatt's Brewing Company and one team won the "A" crown while the other was the best in "B".

Members of the teams were Ed McDermott, D. Capperault, J. Bradley and R. Cash, J. Stamy, and B. Hedley.

# Slalom racing this Sunday

The GT Motorsport Club will be holding their annual Regional Slalom Championships this Sunday at the Control Parking Lot at Highway 401 and Mississauga Road.

The event last year was held at the Zeller's parking lot in Georgetown, but the club was unable to find a suitable facility in Town this year.
