Jeff Haines tosses four-hitter

The Glen Williams Way-Jays erupted for four runs in the sixth inning to take a 5-2 victory over Belwood Sunday in Inter-county fastball play.

The victory ran the Way-Jays season record to three wins and one loss. The Glen was scheduled to play a double header at home against Fergus, but it was rained out.

Jeff Haines was in the pitching circle for the Glen against Belwood. He tossed another excellent game to claim his second victory of the season against no losses.

It appeared Haines might be in a little bit of trouble when D. Lieghton, the games' leadoff batter belted a homerun. However, Haines settled down and retired the next three hitters in order to get out of the first inning without any further damage being done.

In the Glen half of the first Dean Hancock walked to leadoff, but he was stranded at second when Danny Fields

Haines and the Belwood P. Scollard retired their respective opponents with little trouble in the second and third innings.

In their half of the fourth Belwood made it a 2-0 game as they scored an unearned run. Danny Fields booted a ball hit by B. Bryon and the Belwood player scored on L. Clarke's single.

In the Way-Jay half of the fifth Rob Hatcher and Terry Waldrum hit singles when there were two out. The threat was ended when Hancock lined out.

However in the sixth the Way-Jays went to town. Fields started things off by walking. Haines helped his own cause by doubling, scoring Fields, Fendley then scored Haines to tie up the ball game.

Fendley was thrown out on the base paths, but Bert Osborne then contributed a

triple. He scored on Jackie Bergmann's hit. Bergmann scored the fourth Way-Jay run of the inning when Andy Broadbent's hit was bobbled.

The final Way-Jay run of the game was scored the next inning when Haines hit a home run.

FOUR-HITTER

Haines only allowed four hits in the game with the leadoff homer being the only one for extra bases. He struck out 12 Belwood hitters

while walking none.

In the 18 innings Haines has pitched so far this year he has earned a run average of 1.00.

Haines is also the team's leading hitter with a hefty .464 average. Bergman is carrying a .347 average, Paul Mastalerz is at .333 and Scott Haines at .287.

The Way-Jays finally got their bats rolling against Belwood as they slapped out nine hits.
