Lots of fish stocking going on in the Province. Temagami district of the Ministry of Natural Resources started stocking as soon as the ice went out with a total of 44,000 Lake Trout, 31,950 Brook trout and 7,000 Rainbow trout. Truck, fixed wing aircraft and helicopters were used in the planting program due to the accessibility of various waters.

Anglers are to be checked on Lake Temiskaming this year in a program to assess the fishery there. These surveys are important to the continued quality of the fisheries under modern fish management.

Do you enjoy fishing derbies? One of the best in my estimation is the one held at BURNS NATURE AREA. The Halton Region Conservation Authority holds this derby each year with this being the 5th annual and anyone is liable to win.

I have seen 5 and 6 year olds with the bigger fish next to a well equipped "expert" and some of these fish reach a length of 25 inches.
