Daniell wins two at Masters

Bob Daniell won the 1,500 and 5,000 metres events at the North American track and field championships held at Birchmount Stadium in Scarborough last weekend.

Competing in the youngest age class (40 to 44 years old) for Masters Daniell was clocked in the 1,500 in 4:11 and in the 5,000 at 15:45.7.

BETTER TIMES

The Georgetown runner has had better times in both the events, but considering it is still early in the season he was very pleased with his times.

"I've had a 4:05 in the 1,500 and 15:09 (indoors) for the 5,000, but they both came in midseason."

It was Daniell's first track meet this summer. He ran Capital Marathon in May and last week he won the Masters' division in the Sunday Star Trek.

Daniell said he will now begin to seriously train for the World Masters Championships to be run in Europe in late July.

He will first head for Lancastershire, England, to compete in a 10 kilometre race there.

Then he and his wife will head for the World championships at Hanover, West Germany which will begin July 28. There he will be a very busy runner. He will compete in the 800 metres, 1,500 and then for good measure take on the marathon course (26 miles, 385 yards).

"In the next month I will run a few races, but they will strictly be for training purposes... I won't be too worried about times," the runner said.

The World Masters Championships are held every two years. In 1975 they were in Toronto and Daniell, who was then 36, competed in the sub-master class, for runners 35 to 39. He claimed a bronze in the 1,500.

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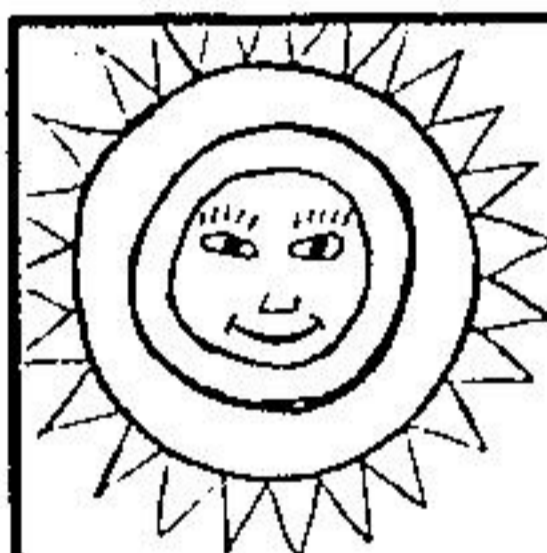


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TOWN OF CALEDON PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT SUMMER FUN '79 DAY CAMP
