Sweden '79 receives plenty of involvement

The Sweden '79 program, with the committee in charge of it receiving plenty of support from the local community and some from the European country, is progressing very well.

Dave Kentner, chairman of the committee, said that many local businesses have jumped in to help out. He said response to advertising in the program was excellent and they have also received help with a couple of promotions.

All the proceeds from the bar at the Miracle Foodmart official opening went to Sweden '79 and the bottle draw

from the Chamber of Commerce Golf Tournament Monday also went towards the project.

Kentner said he should have a name of a speaker for the banquet which will be held at Holy Cross Auditorium during the visit later this week. He has also received sponsorships for the dinner.

The billeting, being handled by Karen Harrison, is now three-quarters complete.

Kentner also said he phoned the Swedish Consulate to get names of companies in Sweden who might be interested in supporting the program.

To date several companies have said they will financially support it.

The dates for the four soccer matches which will be played have also been set. On Sunday July 1 two matches will go commencing at 1 p.m. And at the same time the following Saturday the teams will compete again.

Boosters passes which will entitle holders entrance to all the athletic encounters, both hockey and soccer, are available for \$2. They can be bought from any of the committee members.

Kentner said if there are any proceeds from the venture they will be turned over to the Georgetown Minor Hockey Support Group and Georgetown Youth Soccer.

"It is the hope of the Sweden '79 committee that they would be used for to send Georgetown hockey and soccer groups to compete outside the country," Kentner said.
