

Ontario tourney underway

The Ontario Cup, which is being run by the Ontario Youth Soccer Association and sponsored by Beatrice Foods Limited, will get underway June 9 and 10 with a preliminary round in the Major Mosquito division.

A preliminary round is needed in the Major Mosquito division due to the large number of entries.

There will be 531 teams in total from throughout the province taking part in the Cup play. There are 10 age divisions with boys from eight to 18 years old competing in the tournament.

According to a release from the Beatrice Sports Desk four Georgetown teams are slated to see action in Ontario Cup play, with all starting play on June 23-24.

The Georgetown Minor Atoms will play their first game against the St. Thomas Kickers. The Atoms will see their first action against Woodbridge. The Pee Wees are set to go up against the Rexdale Titans and the juniors' first opponent will be the Cambridge Optimists.
