John Mallet gambled and won when he volunteered his property on the Guelph Line, just north of 25 Sideroad in Halton Hills, to be a test case for an Acton high school building project course. Answering an advertisement in the school newsletter, he agreed to let students build a prefabricated garage for him.

The thirteen students came through in fine style, putting up a large garage in just a little more than two days time which Mr. Mallet figures is "stronger than anything that would have been built by anyone else."

Thirteen students worked on the project, spending an hour a day for three weeks in the classroom prefabricating the parts, one day pouring the foundation and two more days erecting the building.

Wade Vickery, one of the students working on the garage was surprised it went up as quickly as it did.

"I thought it would take at least four days," he said.

Murray Swanston, the teacher in charge of the project, said the structures do not always turn out as well. "You have to be prepared for some-

thing that's not quite the quality you get from professionals."

Maybe Mr. Mallet was just lucky, but he doesn't think so. He went to the school and checked the facilities thoroughly before he agreed to have the students build his garage, to be sure he knew what he was getting.

Mr. Swanston brought the idea for a building project with him when he moved to the area from Kitchener where he has overseen others, when he moved to Acton he found the high school facilities, with the large shop rooms, "were designed for it."

He said the project acts as a work experience for the students where they have to work on something more than a project of their own. "And you get to know them better out here," he commented.

FINAL ITEMS

All that is left for the students to do now is to hang the doors in the doorframes (which fit perfectly). The windows (which also fit perfectly) are already in place. When the doors are hung, and the site cleaned up, all the students will have left to do is go for a swim in Mr. Mallet's built in pool, not a bad way to earn a mark.
