

Mr. Swanston brought the idea for a building project with him when he moved to the area from Kitchener where he has overseen others, when he moved to Acton he found the high school facilities, with the large shop rooms, "were designed

He said the project acts as a work experience for the students where they have to work on something more than a project of their own. "And you get to know them better out here," he commented,
