

Cold weather doesn't stop sharp play at tourney

Limehouse Bantam Girls entered the tournament in Walkerton last Saturday along with teams from Stratford, St. Mary's, Rockwood, Walkerton, Durham, Arthur, and Wroxeter.

Some excellent ball was played despite the cold weather. Limehouse was matched against St. Mary's in the opener, and managed to hang on to edge St. Mary's 18-17 in a 4½ inning contest. Any game in which 1 team was leading by 10 or more

runs after the fifth inning was called. Time limit for every game was 7 innings or 1½ hours.

Both girls, Kendal Batchelor and Rhonda Case reached base safely 5 times between them on walks. The victory put Limehouse into the semi-final round against a heavy favored team from Stratford.
