Haines back

Way-Jays split four Peavoy hits homers

The Glen Williams Way-Jays broke even last week winning two of their four outings. They split a doubleheader with Belwood last Tuesday, were defeated in Orangeville Thursday and defeated Rockwood Sunday night.

The four games marked the halfway point of the season for the Way-Jays. After 16 games they have a record of nine wins and seven losses. They have been in somewhat of a slump winning only two of the last six games.

GOOD NEWS

There is however some very good news for manager John Haines. His son Jeff, who has had a great year so far, pitched nine innings during the four games. The pitcher tore some muscles in his shoulder and it was thought he might miss a few turns. Another pitcher, Moe Curtis, has been busy haying, but he is due to finish that chore next week and start playing more regularly.

Curtis, a pitcher, has only appeared in one game for the Way-Jays so far this year. If he is to qualify to participate in the playoffs he must play in at least five regular season games. The manager said that he expects Curtis to take a least four turns before the regular season ends.

In the doubleheader against Belwood, the Glen lost the first game 7-4 and came back to take the second game 5-2.

In the first game Terry Haines started for the Glen and he got off to a bad start when he made an error on a ball hit back to him. The ball was hit by leadoff hitter Larry Clark. Clark and J. Wharram who got a hit, both scored on another error. In all eight batters went to bat for Belwood in the first. The Way-Jays were lucky to get out of it with only two runs scored against them.

Belwood got one more run in the top of the second inning when McFadden, who got a double scored.

TWO RUNS

The Way-Jays scored two runs in the bottom of the second inning. Glenn Fendley led off with a hit and then Brian Peavoy knocked one out of the park.

Belwood scored three more runs in the top of the fourth and another in the top of the seventh to go ahead 7-3. All four runs were unearned.

In the bottom of the seventh Peavoy hit his second round tripper to make the final 7-4. There is some bad news surrounding Peavoy. He was hit in the leg by a pitch thrown by Jeff Haines in a warmup a few weeks ago. It has been discovered that he has a blood clot in the leg and he will be out of the lineup indefinitely.

GOOD START

In the second game of the doubleheader the Way-Jays pulled ahead 2-0 in the first inning. Dean Hancock, who was hit by a pitch, and Bert

Osborne, who singled, came around on Fendley's hit.

The Way-Jays got one more in the second. Terry Haines hit a triple and scored on an error. In the third the Glen got two more as Joe South brought Osborne and Fendley in.

Terry Haines shutout bid was ruined in the fifth. After he gave up three successive hits, and two runs on relief to finish the game.

In Orangeville the Way-Jay hitters, who had shown signs of coming on in the doubleheader, were stopped cold by Duane Donaldson. It was the second shutout in a row for Donaldson over the Way-Jays.

LOST POISE

As was the case in the previous loss in Orangeville, the Way-Jay fielders lost their poise. All the Orangeville runs were unearned. All the runs were scored in the sixth with the Way-Jays made five errors. Last time Jeff Haines was the victim of sloppy fielding. This time Terry pitched a solid game, but still lost the game.

Haines went the route and only allowed three hits. The Way-Jays also had three hits with Fendley's double being the only extra-bagger.

Jeff Haines started against Rockwood and pitched seven solid shutout innings, before Terry came onto shut the door in the final two.

Bert Osborne led off the fourth with a home run and it proved to be the only support the Haines boys needed.

Acton's Richard leads GIFL all-star voting

Don Richard of the league-leading Acton Merchants polled the most votes for the 1979 Georgetown Industrial Fastball all-star team.

Richard received nine votes and will be the starting catcher for the "A" team. For selecting the all-star teams each opposing team nominated the best two players on the opposing squad for each GIFL game. The players with the most votes made up the first all-star team.

For the GIFL all-star game which will be played at the fairgrounds July 22 the players who received the most votes will be teamed with those who received the fourth most amount of votes. Their opposition will be composed of the players who received the second and third most amount of votes. There were several ties for certain positions so in all 47 players will be invited to play in the game.

MILTON GAME

The players who are deemed to perform the best in the GIFL all-star game will then be asked to play against an all-star team from Milton. That game will be on July 23.

The first all-star team is: Pitchers - Norm Topping, Tom Trevelyan (tied seven points), catcher - Don Richard, first base - Paul Sargent, second base - Bob Allison, third base - Phil Dobbin, shortstop - Andy Trenes, Ken Payne (tied seven votes), left field - Paul Allison, centre field - Wayne Farrow, Wally Williams (tied four votes), right field - Doug Anderson.

The only player to be selected to the first all-star team this year that also earned a spot on the squad last year is Anderson. The fielder was selected as one of the most valuable players in last year's game won by Team A in the twelfth inning.

The coaches for the A team are Roy Hachey of Acton and Philp Publishing's Norm Lockhurst and Howard Kitts. The B team will be coached by Akers-Clark's Wayne Densmore and Gary Louth and C&S Plumbing's Art Budweiser. They are the coaches of the teams which were in first through fourth place teams as of July 6.

This is the first year in which the format of selecting the MVPs for each game was used to select all-star teams.

SUCCESSFUL

The process would seem to have been successful as the first place Merchants will have eight players, the most among the 10 teams, competing in the game. Philp Publishing and Crichton Brothers will each have six players competing and five each from DRG Stationery, C&S Plumbing and Rexway Towing will play in the game. Each of the 10 teams in the league will have at least one player in the game.

A silver collection will be taken during the game with all the proceeds received going to the North Halton Association for the Mentally Retarded.

Umpires Ken Noakes, Barry Jenkins and Glen Cooper will officiate the game and their regular fees will also be

turned over to the Association for the Mentally Retarded.

League president Bryan Lewis said he is in need for a portable P.A. system that can be used at the park during the game. The Molson van was used last year, but it is not available for this game.

The GIFL game will start at 2:15 Sunday afternoon. The Challenge Game against Milton will begin at 8:30 p.m. the next night.
