# Barb Curry earns a shutout in 2 - 0 Royalette victory

Barb Curry made her season debut as pitcher for the Georgetown Legion Royalettes a memorable one as she shutout Cedar Hill 2-0 last Tuesday in going the distance. In their other game last week the Royalettes were defeated 4-1 by Newmarket.

Laura Wilkes and Debbie Shortt have been handling all

the pitching duties this year. Against Cedar Hill, in a game played here last Tuesday, coach Ted Wilkes decided to give his workhorses a rest and the move paid off.

Curry went the full seven innings, and allowed just three hits with two of them coming in the last inning. She struck out three while walking four.

**SCORED EARLY**

The Royalettes did not take long to get on the board. In the first inning Pat White, the second batter up, and Michelle Miehlm hit successive singles. White later came around to score on a fielder's choice. That run proved to be all the support Curry needed.

The Royalette hitters were also held in check as they only got two hits in the game, but they made them both count.

Georgetown got their second run of the game in the fifth inning. Joey Bennett, who had gotten on on an error, scored on a single by Curry.

Cedar Hill only had a runner as far as third base once in the game. That was in the seventh when their first two batters both hit singles. However, Curry came back to get the next hitter on a strike out.

She got the next batter to pop up to first basemen Janette Mackay. The game ended when L. Lumley grounded out to third basemen Monica Pollock.

**HAD INNING**

In the game against Newmarket one bad inning spelled defeat for the Royalettes. Newmarket got three of their four runs in the fourth inning.

Shortt was back in the pitching circle for the Royalettes and aside from that one bad inning she had a good outing.

The Royalettes scored the game's first run in the top of the fourth inning. Mackay led off with a double and she crossed the plate when a ball hit by Joey Bennett was bobbled.

In the bottom of the inning

Newmarket got their four runs on four successive hits.

The Royalettes had an excellent chance to get back into the game in the top of the sixth. Mackay hit a single with one out. Nancy Shortill and Bennett then both hit singles. However, Mackay was gunned down at the plate trying to score. Shortill was stranded at third and Bennett was left at second.

Newmarket scored a final run in the bottom of the sixth on two singles.

Shortt allowed just six hits in the game, four in the fourth and two in the sixth. The Royalettes had seven hits in the game, but could only get the one run across as three runners were thrown out in the basepaths.
