Weights down in fish contest

Ontario Outdoors

In the first two months of the Molson's and Untario Federation of Anglers and Hunters annual fishing contest, the weights are below last years winners.

Whatever the size of your fish, if it is in the minimum weight category, then enter it. You may have a winner. By the second week in July there had been no entry

in the Largemouth bass or salmon division but July usually shows some good bass and September the salmon. As of July 6, all three entries in the muskie division were entered by the same man, from the same waters, Wabigoon Lake in Barclay Township. Craig Dawson is the

fisherman with his largest 24 pound-14 ounces. This will probably be beaten, and probably in the fall, when the largest muskies are usually taken. The largest smallmouth bass was taken from

Rainey Lake and weighed in at 4 pound 131/2 ounces. Don't forget each entry receives a Michael Dumas print, and I am only too pleased to display mine.

To get the edge on catching a large pike or Muskie, try the BELIEVER lure by Drifter Tackle. In the Michigan-Ontario Muskie club in 1978, out of the top 20 entries 12 were taken on the BELIEVER. I think that says a lot for the effectiveness of the lure and I can youch for it. I have turned the tide in my favour when it comes to Bass fishing.

I started using the SASSY SHAD as a spinnerbalt almost exclusively, where I use spinner baits. The SASSY SHAD can be used alone on a hook as you would use a plastic worm, or on a jig hook.

VARIETY OF SIZES

On a fly rod for bass, I use the TUTTLE DEVIL BUGS from DAREDEVLE. These bugs come in a variety of sizes and shapes as well as colours, and look for all the world like the bugs and mice that lunker bass feed on, I took a five pounder on WING BASS Devil Bug in ACTON'S Fairy Lake last week, and the wings on this bug look like a beetle or huge moth on the surface and with a slight twitch it came alive.

The Devil Bug Mouse is a terrific lure for large bass and also pike and muskie. I would highly recommend them if you like surface action, and they can be used on spinning tackle which increases their use. The SALMON season is almost upon us and the DAREDEVLE folk put out a great salmon lure, the SAGAMORE FLASH with FLY. These are designed with the COHO and CHINOOK fishing in mind. This is a spoon-fly combination and the effectiveness of the "twinkle" flies are well known. The KOHOFLY is also a great lure for these super fish and should not be passed up when buying tackle for the salmon fishing.

There are a lot of charter boats operating on Lake

Ontario for salmon. As I mentioned in last week's ONTARIO OUTDOORS for salmon and I will try to research as many of them as I can for the high point of the season. These will be published in this column each week with as much info as possible with each the same as last year. If you know of a good charter boat and have had good luck with them, please call me with the information. I will contact them for

complete details.

CONFUSION There still seems to be a lot of confusion in regards to the F.A.C. the FIREARMS ACQUISITION CERTIFICA-TES. It is wise to obtain one now if you plan to get a firearm in the near future. You must have one for the acquisition of any firearm, rifle or shotgun, or even an airgun with a muzzle velocity of over 500 feet per second. It matters not if the firearm is obtained by purchase, loan or trade, from a dealer or private individual. Even if you get the gun from a relative you need an FAC.

The certificiate is valid anywhere in Canada for five years and covers any number of acquisitions, and the cost is ten dollars. Don't leave it until the rush period just before the hunting season, and then complain about the slow service, do it now. Winchester Canada Ltd. is sponsoring a draw of FOUR DOVE SHOOTS TO HONDURAS valued at \$1000 each and four Commemorative rifles at \$399 each in order for the hunting fraternity to get their F.A.C.'s early.
