

Emmuel leads local cricketers to a victory

A strong performance by Emmanuel led the Georgetown Cricketers to a win over Oakville this week.

In the lovely setting at Appleby College, Oakville won the toss and batted first. Budrie and Jaggernath opened the innings and took the score to 23 before Jaggernath was caught by Emmanuel at silly mid-off, off Windsor. At 32 Windsor had Medfore LBW, and with the score at 37 Budrie was run out in a strange fashion. He had just hit Windsor for a straight four, and in attempting the same shot, the ball was accidentally blocked by the other batsmen Coombs. Windsor picked up the ball and threw down Budrie's wicket before he got back. Clyde Samaroo replaced brother Neville, bowling ex-

remely well and should have had Mufti caught before he had scored 10. Windsor had Coombs caught behind by Jones and when Samaroo bowled Bostock and Curtis in consecutive overs the score was 45 for 6.

Singh joined Mufti and while two more catches were put down off Samaroo, the batsman hit the ball hard and took the score to 112 before the 7th wicket fell, when Lakham bowled Singh.

LITTLE RESPITE

There was to be little respite for the Georgetown bowlers as Van Harte and Mufti took advantage of any loose balls, and some not so loose. At 131 Mufti was caught and bowled by Clyde Samaroo for 48, the score being 131.

Some good hitting by Sardanna and Van Harte in-

creased the score to 168 when Harte was run out, and Perry was last man out at 176, again being run out.

From 45-6 when Georgetown had the upper hand the last four wickets put on 131 runs. Samaroo bowled 18 overs in claiming three wickets for 48, but if catches had been held, could have had 6. Oakville in scoring 176 batted for 3½ hours which left Georgetown only 2 hours to score the runs, an almost impossible task.

Mongru and Jahoor opened for Georgetown against a pace attack of Van Harte and Budrie who took advantage of the wicket, bowling short of a length, occasionally making the ball kick viciously. Jahoor took two fours off Harte and then Mongru played the best shot of the game, as he hooked a short ball from Budrie for 6, literally taking the ball off his chin.

Jahoor was first out at 16, being caught behind. Emmanuel joined Mongru and after a couple of "uppish" shots settled down. Mongru

batted very intelligently, drawing the ball with ease. Unfortunately when Singh came onto bowl he got an edge to a short ball outside the off stump, as he tried to square cut and Georgetown were 46 for 2.

Singh quickly claimed three quick wickets while Emmanuel kept the other end going playing good solid defensive cricket. Ragbir having watched the demise of four batsmen to Singh, promptly hit him for three consecutive fours over long off and long-on. When Ragbir was out the score was 76-7, his share 15. Tancoo came to the wicket and while the fielders crowded him he played very well for four overs, before being brilliantly caught at backward short leg, close to the ground.

Emmanuel continued to bat with great concentration digging out many balls which kept very low. Having bowl-

ed so well, it was fitting that Samaroo should be at the wicket when time ran out, but if it hadn't been for Emmanuel keeping his end going, Georgetown would definitely have lost.

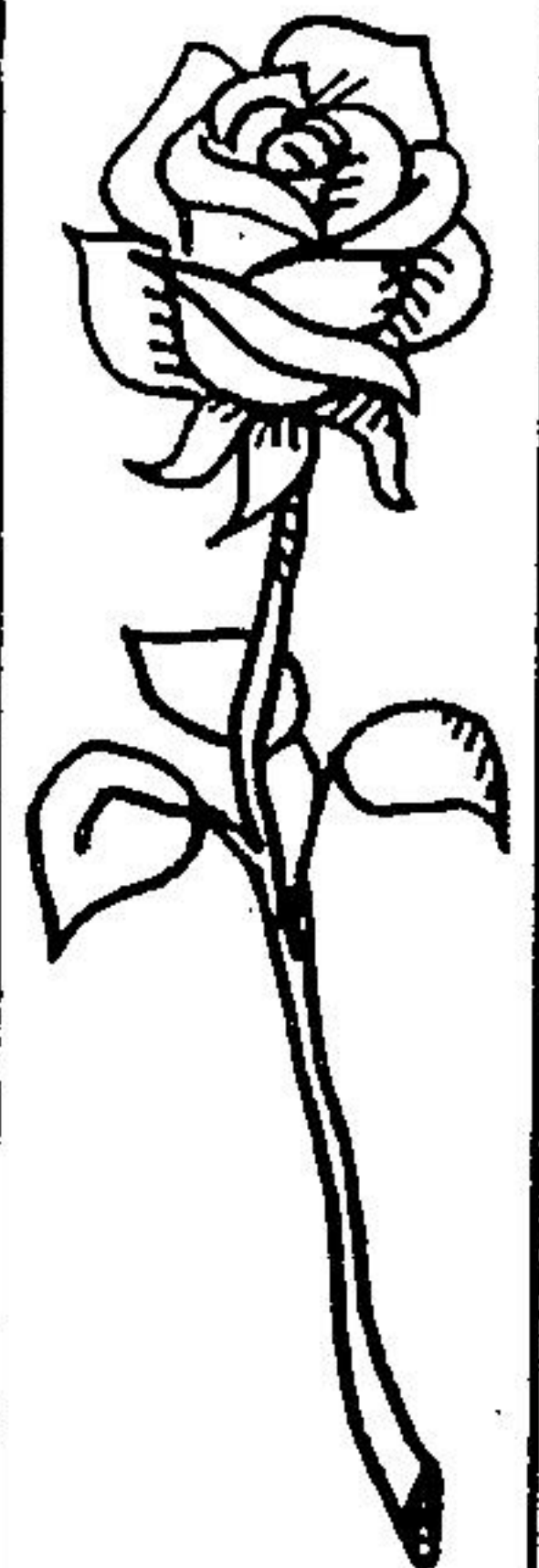
