

At Ontario Open

Hurley and partner take their second title

Georgetown's Stacey Hurley and her doubles partner Lynn Salo claimed their second major title in a row when they took the under 16 second at the Ontario Junior Open Tennis Championship staged last week at Niagara-on-the-Lake.

Hurley and Salo were also the best in the division at the Ontario Closed Championship held recently.

In the first round Hurley and Salo, seeded number three for the tournament, defeated Susie Hatch and Libby Wilkinson of London 6-3, 6-2.

UPSETS

It was in the second round that Hurley and Salo began pulling off upsets. They handled the number two seeds, S. Hunter and Bonnie Brown of Vancouver, 6-0, 4-6, 6-4. That victory gave them a berth in final.

In the final Hurley and Salo were pitted against the number one seeds, Jana Klepic and M. Guerin of Ottawa. They took the title with a 6-2,

3-6, 6-2 victory.

Hurley went all the way to the semi-finals in singles play before being eliminated.

In the first round she defeated Paula Shepard of Bradford 6-4, 7-5.

In the quarter-finals she was once again up against Salo. For the second time in a row Hurley defeated her doubles partners. She won the tough match 4-6, 7-6, 6-2.

At one stage in this match Hurley was down one set and trailed in the second 1-5, but she came back to take it. Hurley had also defeated Salo at the Ontario Closed Championship.

Hurley's opponent in the semi-final was Jana Klepic. The two players had also met in the final of the Ontario Closed Championships.

SAME FASHION

Klepic defeated Hurley in much the same fashion at both championships. She got off to a quick start and then after dropping the second set came back to take the third.

At the Ontario Open Klepic

won the first match easily by a 6-0 score. Hurley fought back in the second set to win it 7-6 in a tiebreaker to force a third and deciding set.

In the third set Klepic won 6-2 to advance to the final. Klepic eventually won the singles title to add it to her Ontario Closed crown.

The Ontario Junior Open is held as an initial testing ground for the provinces juniors at an international level. Aside from the provinces' top juniors, the championship also featured entries from the rest of Canada and several from the United States. The Open was staged in three locations in southern Ontario.

Many of the players had to go through qualifying rounds to earn a berth in the Open. Hurley's record gave her direct entry in the championship.

This past Monday Hurley began play in the Quebec Open Championship where she will compete in both singles and doubles.

There have been a number of spinal (back) injuries occurring in back yard pools this summer due to unsafe practices, such

as individuals taking too long a dive and/or not keeping their hands over their heads when diving.

There are many other safe practices that you may not be aware of. Some of these may include the safe handling and storing of pool chemicals, how to assist a person who may get into trouble because they can't swim, how to apply artificial respiration if necessary, etc. If you would like to learn about any of the above and more, you can by contacting the pools.

The Recreation Department Aquatic staff will go out and give a demonstration on the above. If you would like to have a clinic held for your family and neighbourhood,

then arrange for a backyard pool and then call the Assistant Supervisor at the Georgetown Pools - 877-7721 or 877-1021, or Craig Gordon at the Acton pool - 853-3140.
