

Use large lure in the summer

Probably the most important thing to remember in summer fishing: use larger lures as the bait fish grow during the season. Some fish that are preyed upon by game fish in the spring, such as perch will now, however, be too large to some species of game fish to utilize.

SPINNER BAIT

When using a spinner bait, use a tandem blade model, and the addition of a rubber band tied to the eye and hooked over the barb will make it virtually weedless. This is the season to use grasshoppers for trout. Hook them as per the diagram with this column and fish them along under cut banks where trout hide. This type of fishing is best accomplished by wading and casting to the far bank. Do not use any weight at all, and use fine wire hooks. Hoppers are best caught early in the morning when they are chilled and immobile. Hook them under the collar for long life and trout will often take this bait savagely, and in my experience the big "locust" is the best.

In ponds use them wherever you feel trout may be, as grasshoppers are often blown away out over the water and sometimes simply fly in the wrong direction. With the concentration on Coho Salmon this fall, here is a list of lures that are recommended and all available in good sporting stores.

J-Plug, Fire Plug, Bomber Long "A", Andy Reeker, Fishback, Mepps Trolling Fly, Flutter Spoon, Flatfish, Manistee, Flutterlite, Tadpole, Action Fly, Jons Fly, Hootchtall, and Ping-A-Tec. There are others, but this should give you a reasonable selection and remember what I said last week, use a lure that resembles the Alewife found in the Great Lakes.

You can catch Coho without the use of a downrigger, but not nearly as effectively. The "planning device" called Pink Lake is the "poor man's downriggers" and gets the lure down to the right depth by angling down until tripped by a strike. It is then angled to the surface and all on a regular fishing outfit. You would have to see one to understand fully, but they work and very well at that.

There are other models such as the Deep Six and the Oregon Diver and these should be readily available also, and they can get your lure down to as much as 100 feet but you will not be sure of how deep you are fishing. If you have a walkie talkie, C.B., or V.H.F., then take it along as they are all used out on the fishing grounds and will go a long way to getting you in the right spot at the right time.
