Erosion project proceeds

The town's general committee has formally asked the Credit Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA) to begin engineering work on a major erosion control project which will see stormwater along Armstrong Avenue in Georgetown channelled through a large sewer outfall.

Subject to approval next week by council, the CVCA will be asked to include in its engineering designs for the project any related drainage work deemed necessary, which the town will finance.

The "major outfail" proposed for installation by the CVCA will direct eroding stormwaters to the base of the river valley below Armstrong Avenue, where extensive erosion is threatening the south valley

Town engineer Bob Austin advised the committee Monday night that he is checking on the availiability of subsidy grants from the provincial government which would help cover the cost of drainage sewers the town must install in the Armstrong-Sinclair Avenue area.

Mr. Austin expressed hope that engineering can be completed this fall and tenders for the projects called by the end of the year. The project itself should be completed next year, he said.

The CVCA has estimated the overall cost of the project at \$110,000, of which the town will pay approximately 43 per cent plus the cost of drainage pipes along Armstrong, calculated at \$16,000 to \$50,000, depending on the alternative selected.

Halton region will contribute 43 per cent of the \$30,000 allocated to the project for 1979, with the balance of costs to be invoiced next year.



The company's lands along Mountainview Road South have, in fact, been excluded from the Halton region official plan, he added, indicating the region and town are making no provisions for the develop-

TOWN DISCOVERED If the town or developer discovered a means of expanding Georgetown's sewage plant or otherwise making room for the proposed development, Mayor Pomeroy stressed, council would be "derelict in its duty" to continue rejecting McLaughlin's plans. The proposal would then have to be re-examined, he said.

"We're not covering it up with a blanket," Mayor Pomeroy said, "but there's been no indication that development is imminent."

A motion by Coun. Levy to have the GARA informed in writing of the town's current position in the matter was defeated by the committee. Mr. Duggan's letter was simply received and filed.

WELLES VISIT Orson Welles, who reportedly may visit Georgetown today to get acquainted with the various locations, has been accommodated with a priate home in Oakville. The rotund star, well-knwon for his sophisticated manner and gourmet appetile, first captured the world's attention when his 1939 radio broadcast of H.G. Wells' The Ward of the World inadvertently panicked thousands of New York residents, causing a mass exodus from a city whose residents were convinced was under Martian at-

Mr. Welles made a lasting impression in the film medtum, as well, with Citizen Kane, a blockbuster 1940's epic still revered by film buffs around the world. Mr. Welles directed and starred in the fictionalized biography based loosely on the career of newspaper magnate William Ran-

dolph Hearst. Dozens of films made since which both starred and were directed by the accomplished actor have not fared as well with movie audiences, atthough film critics have been almost invariably impressed. The Third Man was among his more notable films.
