



Soap box derby set for September weekend

A soap box derby for youngsters between seven and 14 years old will be held in Georgetown on Sunday, September 19.

The derby is actually being called the Seventh Annual Halton Hills Grand Prix, but actually the event was not held last year as town council refused to sanction it.

The event is slated to go on Trafalgar Road, at Stewarttown, and any youngster between seven and 14 years old who has parental consent and waiver form is invited to compete.

John Chandler is the chief organizer of the event and he told the Herald that 12 trophies will be given out during the day. McDonald's will be the chief sponsor of the derby.

FOUR GROUPS

The youngsters will be divided into four groups and three trophies will be awarded in each of them.

Youngsters between seven and 11 will be in the junior group and the 12 to 14 year olds will be race as seniors. Each of the age groups will then be divided into two groups depending on the quality of vehicle.

Mr. Chandler said there will also be a separate category for 12 racers from the

Canadian Soap Box Racers Association who are scheduled to make an appearance.

Public Announcement

Multilingual Television Broadcasting

At the public hearings held in Toronto in September 1977 and 1978, the Commission heard numerous representations from the public and the broadcasting industry on the need for a multilingual television station to serve the Metropolitan Toronto region.

On December 1978, the Commission issued a Public Announcement entitled "Multilingual Television Broadcasting" outlining the new policy for multilingual television. At the same time, the Commission issued a licence to Multilingual Television (Toronto) Limited subject to the terms outlined in that announcement. A Public Hearing was held in Hull, Quebec, on 20 and 21 June 1979 to consider an application to amend this licence to change the channel frequency, increase the effective radiated power and to change the location of the transmitter to the CN Tower Toronto. The attached Decision CRTC 79-452 approves this application.

In the Public Announcement of 27 December 1978, the Commission did not address the particulars of the carriage of the multilingual television station on cable television systems but awaited an indication from the licensee that the station's programming was fully operational. The Commission reiterates the view expressed in previous public announcements that as a Canadian station it has the same cable carriage priority status as other Toronto television stations in accordance with Section 6 of the Cable Television Regulations. However, cable television licensees can apply to the Commission for exemption from this carriage requirement. Such applications will be considered on a case by case basis. Interested parties in this matter are reminded of the Commission's emphasis in the original decision on the provision by Multilingual Television (Toronto) Limited of a service with specific programming designed primarily to meet the needs of the various linguistic groups in Metropolitan Toronto.

At the public hearing on 20 and 21 June 1979, an intervention was heard from the Ontario Cable Television Association expressing their problems with the carriage of the multilingual television signal on the basic service. The multilingual television licensee, Mr. Ianuzzi, replied as follows to a question related to cable carriage:

"But, certainly in areas where there are very few multicultural communities... we don't expect to be carried on basic service."

Attached is the list of the 56 cable systems on which the multilingual television service is expected to be distributed according to regulation. As the station is expected to be operational by September 1979, the Commission expects all affected licensees to submit applications for carriage. Each application should advise which channel is intended for distribution of the multilingual service and also indicate, where applicable, the resulting reallocations of channel distribution.

From the spacious double doored entry, past the ample storage closet, one moves naturally right to the long rectangular living room. The living room offers excellent natural lighting and highly flexible furniture placing area for formal entertaining. The adjacent dining room may be left open by means of an archway, or kept separate via lowered or French doors. The dining room is well-suited to large and classic dining room furniture.

The U shape kitchen is large, yet allows ease of movement and an excellent work triangle for step-saving. The kitchen extends to a large dinette area for every day family meals, leaving the formal dining room for entertaining. Central placement of the kitchen between the dinette and dining room enables excellent separation of formal and family meals. Sliding glass doors from the dinette provide access down to the rear patio for outdoor dining in fine weather.

Another important feature of this design is the practicality and proximity of the family room which leads off the kitchen and dinette. The central island fireplace is the focal point of this convivial room, and may be finished in attractive fieldstone as a masonry unit or an energy-efficient heater-type unit installed.

A large laundry-utility room and two piece vanity bath is adjacent to the kitchen and the garage, the latter feature allowing it to double as a mud room.

The second storey is designed as four full-sized bedrooms and a well designed master bathroom. The master bedroom is enormous, with a den area off to one side, ample closet storage, and a three piece ensuite with tub. The fireplace is central to the master bedroom, exactly as in the family room on the main floor. All three secondary bedrooms are large, have ample closet storage and excellent natural light.

The full basement affords the growing family abundant space for the future development of additional bedrooms, a second family room, or other recreational facilities. A two-car garage, with space for the installation of a workbench for the home handyman, completes the amenities of this fine and impressive colonial design.
