

Main St. may remain with region

A proposal before Halton region's public works committee which would see responsibility for the Main Street of both Georgetown and Milton returned to the area municipalities will be rejected, committee vice-chairman Mike Armstrong has prohibited.

The Halton Hills regional councillors told The Herald this week he expects town engineer Bob Austin to advise against the move in a forthcoming report requested by the regional committee.

Bob Moore, the region's director of public works, recommended the deletion of the two Main Streets from the regional road system in response to concerns expressed by some committee members over the volume of requests received from various groups to have the roads closed for parades and other activities.

At the urging of Halton Hills councillors Armstrong and Huss Miller and Milton Coun. Bill Johnson, the works committee last week agreed to postpone a decision on Mr. Moore's recommendation and seek comments from the town engineers for Halton Hills and Milton.

REJECT PROPOSAL

Coun. Armstrong expressed confidence this week that Mr. Austin will reject the proposal on town council's behalf. Commenting that the street's reversion to local control would have little effect on the current situation or on applications for special uses of the street, Coun. Armstrong speculated that a majority of Halton Hills councillors believe Main Street should remain the region's responsibility.

Ironically, the committee was simultaneously asked to approve an application from the Lions Club of Georgetown for permission to use Main Street as part of the route for the club's 49th annual Santa Claus parade, to be held this year December 1.

As recommended for approval by the committee, the parade route will begin at Moore Park plaza and follow Main Street and Maple Avenue back to Highway 7, then to the Delrex Market centre.

"Obviously, the function of the road would not be serving the purpose of a main thoroughfare, but rather it would be serving the local downtown commercial shops," he said. "It seems more reasonable that the jurisdiction over that public roadway should be vested."
