# Hurley and partner champs at Quebec Open

Georgetown's Stacey Hurley and her partner Lynn Salo of Toronto completed the grand slam as they won the Doubles title at the Quebec Junior Tennis Championship last week.

Previously Hurley and Salo had taken the title at Ontario Closed Championship and the Ontario Open. In the final of the Quebec

Open Hurley and Salo, who were seeded number one for the tournament, defeated Jana Klepec and M. Guerin of Ottawa 4-6, 6-3, 7-6. The Quebec Open was the

first tournament of the year in which Hurley and Salo were seeded number one. The previous week at the Ontario Open they were seeded number three. In the

Hurley and Salo both had excellent tournaments all-around as they both advanced to the finals in the singles competition.

Salo took the Quebec singles championship with a 6-4, 1-6, 6-1 victory over her doubles partner. Hurley had defeated Salo in singles at both the Ontario Open and Ontario Closed.

The next stop for Hurley on the tour will be the biggest one as she competes in the Canadian National Junior Tennis Championships to be held in Montreal. The tournament is already underway.

Hurley will be seeded number four in singles at the Nationals. The number one seed for the tournament will be T. Walters, a Canadian who has been training and playing in California for the past five years. The number two seed will be D. Blondeau of Quebec and Salo will be seeded number three.

## Ladies "A" team ties

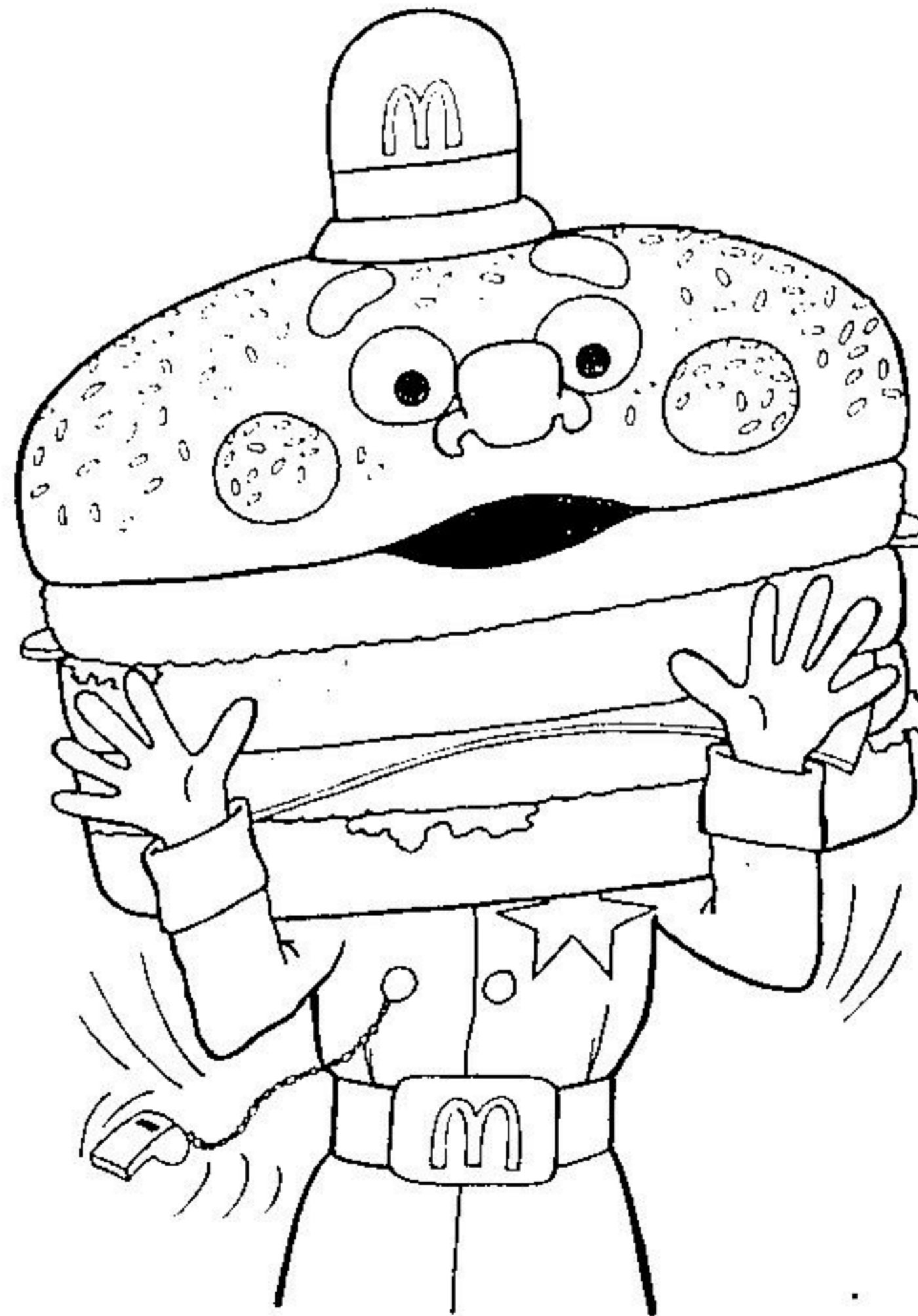
The Gordon Alcott Tennis Club's Ladies "A" team played the Ontario Rockets in a 2-2 draw in action last Wednesday.
