Boat Association is reformed

The Ontario Charter Boat Association has been reformed, with 54 members. The original association has been dissolved as not being effective any longer due to the increase in the member and type of charter operators.

This will be the Toronto Chapter, and others will be founded for Lake Huron and Erie, and possibly others as time proves the need. There are a great many boat owners that would like to bill you of \$50 to \$200 for some Salmon fishing, and the Ontario Charter Boat Association will give some credibility and security to the fishermen and give a good name to those operators that are on the level.

Ron Penfound is heading it up and Monty Smith, Bob Barr and others are going to make the organization work.

It is felt by some including this writer, that the Great Salmon Hunt contest is scheduled too early in the season to be very effective. The dates are August 18 to September 30 and the best of the season is Labor Day weekend to the end of October or more correctly October 15.

Of course the Toronto Star is running the Hunt this year, taking over from Dan Thomey who started the contest. The prizes are worth a big \$100,000 with twin first prizes of Jeep Cherokee, 115 HP Mercury Outboard motor, 17 ft. Wilker boat, trailer, fishing tackle, and Sonar by Garcia.

There will be six weekly contests with prizes totalling \$25,000 and four special categories: Large Chinook, Largest Rainbow, Largest Brown and Largest Lake Trout.

The main prizes are for the Largest Coho Salmon and a draw prize for all Coho entered, so every entry has an equal chance of winning. The entry fee is \$10 and is available at all participating Canadian Tire Stores including the one in Georgetown. Other outlets also carry the contest entry forms so check around and be sure to enter, as net proceeds go to Conservation. The Salmon fishing has not been good yet, in fact I have heard of only one fish caught.

This was a ten pound Coho taken last Friday between Bronte and Oakville, but things are expected to pick up soon and then rise to a peak as the salmon head to the rivers, streams and shores where they were planted or are enticed by the ministry programs.

Monty Smith of Happy Pappy Charters has just taken possession of his new boat, a 28 foot pacemaker. This one will hold 6 persons and crew and is fully equipped with sonar, temp gage and all fishing tackle. The rate is \$50 for an 8 hour session, and he has another boat, an M.F.G. with all conveniences.

The Pacemaker has on board washrooms, so men and women can fish without embarrassment all day. Monty has all Zebeo tackle on board and can be depended on for top quality and a vast knowledge of Salmon fishing.

Why not scout now for fall hunting areas? Places to hunt ducks, grouse, etc. A walk in the warm summer woods will also give you an appreciation of nature and a knowledge of where to look in certain areas.

Hunter safety courses will be held at Cold Creek Conservation area, Aug. 20, 22, 25, and 26th. This will include lectures and practical demonstrations, and those taking the course will then be eligible to take the Ministry of Natural Resources licence exam. Interested persons must pre-register by contacting Lou Romhanyi at 749-0747 or 661-6600 ext. 286.

Get an edge on the hunting season with this course and while I am talking about an edge, how is your knife? Learn how to put an edge on your outdoors knife, whatever type you use and be always ready for any emergency.

There are usually four kinds of sharpening stone but the ones that interest an outdoorsman are Soft Arkansas the best all round and Washita for putting an edge of a badly worn blade. After treatment with the Washita, you should finish the job with the Soft Arakanasa and keep it up. Treat these stones with care and they will last a life time and they are expensive. Wash them in running water and let dry before use, and then use plenty of oil to float particles of steel as you work the blade.

The Salmon Hunter kit that I made available last year will once again be ready and updated. If you are new to salmon fishing or wish to round out your knowledge, send for the kit to 25 Carole St., Georgetown, L7G 3X5 and enclose 50 cents for costs.

Ontario's new 30% incentive to invest in small business

Small Business Development Corporations Program

This new program is designed to encourage private sector investment in small businesses throughout Ontario by the formation of Small Business Development Corporations.

The Incentive

Investors who purchase equity shares in a Small Business Development Corporation receive financial incentives that amount to a 30% grant for individuals and a 30% tax credit for corporations. On a \$1,000 investment, individual investors get a \$300 grant and corporations a \$300 tax credit against Ontario Corporations Income Tax. It's a straightforward process and the Ministry of Revenue is ready to receive applications.

Formation of a Small Business Development Corporation

An individual, corporation or group of investors can set up a Small Business

Development Corporation to invest in eligible small businesses, if certain requirements are met
