

Georgetown cricketers battle Brantford

The Georgetown Cricket Club earned a draw against first-place Brantford in action at Yoderfield Sunday.

On a relatively placid pitch Brantford won the toss, and batted first. Windsor and Kumar opened the bowling both moving the ball in the

air, and off the wicket. Before the score reached 5, both opening batsmen had been dropped, one to prove very costly.

A very good catch by Emmanuel at first slip gave Georgetown its first success with the score 16. After being dropped twice, Bakshi took advantage and proceeded to hit the ball very hard and aggressively. The next wicket fell to N. Samaroo at 62, when he had Brookes L.B.W. for 12, and then bowled Payne at 68, with a beautiful ball that just took the bails off.

Bakshi continued to hit out piling up the score. He was fourth, being well caught by Windsor at long on, off the bowling of Kumar who had changed to bowling leg-breaks. The score was 113 and Bakshi had scored 79.

FELL QUICKLY

The remaining wickets fell quickly, mainly to Kumar who mixed his leg-breaks very intelligently with a faster ball. He was aided by a nice piece of stumping by Jones and another sharp catch by C. Samaroo. Brant-

ford were all out for 144.

Jahoor and Mongru opened for Georgetown against the fastest attack in the league of Brookes and Payne. Brookes third ball was shot and Mongru made a beautiful hook for 4, however, he was bowled by Payne with perhaps the best ball of the match. It was an sway-slinger pitching on the middle, moving very late to take the off stump.

Jahoor taking advantage of a dropped catch played very well, square cutting both bowlers for four. At 19 Emmanuel was bowled playing over a yorker. Kumar

came to the wicket and hit Brookes over extra cover for 4. At 54 Kumar was bowled for 17 having hit four fours and looking very comfortable. The ball was a full toss which Kumar hit over the top of. Jones and Jahoor continued to bat well and victory was a distinct possibility, however Jahoor was bowled by a ball that kept low with score at 72. His share was 36. Jahoor has really come on these past few weeks, as in two friendly games against London, and Kitchener he scored 54 and 42.

When Jones was caught out

at 80 after scoring 12 the tide swung in Brantford's favour. They bowled short of a length making it difficult to get the ball away and Windsor and Lakhan were content to play time out, Windsor being 17 not out and Lakhan 11 not out, and the Georgetown score 114-6 wickets.
