olis. Many, many moons ago a vast number of individuals and organizations were asked to participate in providing information, ideas and proposals for "the master plan." The plan, when put together, was to be presented to those who fed the input, and others if they wanted it, for whatever purpose.

Lo and Behold! The master plan appeared as a document - ah! Not for public scrutiny, though, The plan had to be muked, changed or whatever by the administration. This, . in spite of the assurance and promise of issue to public.

Lo and behold again! The capital forecast is reported in the press - and based on "The Master Plan" duly exsurged by the administrat-

Further, in spite of conversations and correspondence, the recreation department, administration and mayor did not even have the courtesy to advise the soccer groups of the so called "Publie Presentation" of forecast and master plan at last week's planning board.
