# Kumar's century score leads cricketers

A brilliant century score by Ashok Kumar led the Georgetown Cricket Club to a victory over Niagara in away action Sunday.

Georgetown, batting first, made a cautious start against Niagara's opening attack.

Mongru was first out being bowled by Singh with the score 20 however this was not until the 11th over when most of the shine had been removed from the ball.

Emmanuel and Jahoor moved the score along steadily and when Niagara made

its first bowling change, Emmanuel welcomed the new bowler with a straight 4 and 6. In the next over Emmanuel tried to sweep and was out L.B.W. for 24 out of 60. He was quickly followed by Jahoor for the same score, who was stumped

going down the wicket too fast.

This brought Kumar and Jones to the wicket. They quickly increased the rate of scoring, running very well between the wickets and hitting anything loose to the boundary. Jones and Kumar put on 67 for the 4th wicket, Jones being caught after he made 27, the Georgetown score being 128.

From then on it was all Kumar who gave an exhibition of batting that would have pleased any eye. To demonstrate the control he had, the fifth wicket put on 40 runs, but when Windsor was bowled, he had only 9. Kumar continued on demoralizing the bowling, as he hooked, drove and cut the ball with majestic ferocity.

After 9 overs Niagara were 6 runs for 6 wickets, Windsor taking 4 for 1, and Samaroo 2 for 5. When a team is on top the feeling becomes infectious, as demonstrated by Emmanuel, who caught Singh at first slip off Windsor, with a ball that was low to his left side. A superb catch!

The Niagara captain, Gudgeon, in sheer desperation proceeded to hit out at every ball, leading a charmed life as he nicked and clouted his way to 32 before he was caught at deep wide mid on by Mongru. Mongru must have run thirty yards before throwing himself forward to

catch the ball, literally an inch from the ground, which brought the whole team over

to him to offer their congratulations. After that, there was no further resistance. Windsor finished with 7-18 and Samaroo 3-34, the Niagara team being bowled out in 20 overs.

It was a very satisfying game for the whole team, but the innings of Kumar will remain a highlight for years to come.

**APPOINTMENT TO HALTON HILLS HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION**

Bill 119 establishes the new Halton Hills Hydro Electric Commission for the term expiring on the 30th day of November, 1980. The Halton Hills Hydro Commission shall consist of the Mayor of the Town of Halton Hills and the following additional members who shall be appointed by Council for the Town of Halton Hills:

- (i) Two members of the Hydro Electric Commission of the Town of Georgetown as it existed immediately before the coming into force of this Act.
- (ii) One member of the Hydro Electric Commission of the Town of Acton as it existed immediately before the coming into force of this Act.
- (iii) One person who resides outside the part of the Town of Halton Hills supplied with power by the municipal commissions mentioned in paragraphs (i) and (ii) immediately before coming into force of this Act.

Applications for this position defined in Section (iii) above may be submitted to the undersigned until 4:00 p.m. Friday, August 24th, 1979 from eligible person (s) who desire to have their names considered for appointment by Council.

A person(s) interested in this appointment must be a qualified elector under The MUNICIPAL Elections Act, 1977 and resides outside the part of the Town of Halton Hills supplied with power by the municipal commissions mentioned in the above Sections (i) and (ii).
