# Halton Hills sewage sludge lagoon expanding for extra five months' use

A major sewage sludge lagoon will be expanded for another five months' capacity in accordance with the terms of a haulage contract expected to be signed between Halton region and Alexholmes Farms of R.R.2 Georgetown.

Subject to regional council's approval today (Wednesday), Alexholmes Farms will be awarded the \$66,240 contract for receiving waste sludge from the Acton and Georgetown sewage treatment plants.

The region's public works committee sanctioned the farm's tender bid last week and recommended that Gerhard Treviranus, Alexholmes'

owner, should be reimbursed \$2,000 for the cost of expanding sludge storage facilities to handle the effluent for the next five months.

Incidents of spillage at the farm's existing lagoon prompted the committee to attach several conditions to the contract, including the installation of "sufficient freeboard" to guard against overflow, consultation with regional staff and regular inspections.

The committee's recommendations came following a visit to Alexholmes Farms August 14 by Halton Hills Coun. Russ Miller and other regional and provincial officials.

The inspectors found that the

farm's existing lagoon has enough capacity for another month's storage, but will be expanded in accordance with the new haulage contract so it can be used for five more months.

"There are 450 acres of land available for relieving and,

of this, only 150 acres per year will be required under the new 1978 guidelines," public works director Bob Moore commented. "As this is a two-year contract, approximately two-thirds of the available land will be required."

Mr. Treviranus recently

admitted publicly that there have been mishaps during the past two years in which some sludge spilled onto neighboring properties. In each instance, however, immediate action was taken to resolve problems and the appropriate authorities were contacted.

**THE ANNUAL MUNICIPAL ENUMERATION STARTS NEXT WEEK**

The annual municipal enumeration will begin on Tuesday, September 4, 1979. During this month, an enumerator, carrying a proper identification card, will call at your residence for a few minutes to check basic information required in determining:

- the allocation of education property taxes between the public and separate school systems;
- the distribution of provincial grants to local governments to help reduce local tax bills;
- the preparation of jurors' lists; and
- population information needed for other municipal programs.

The enumerator must record such information as the name, age, property status (e.g. owner or tenant), school support and residency of all members of the household.

When the enumerator visits, please check that the information on the Enumeration Notice is correct. If it is not, revise it and verify the changes.

If you are not home, a Notice will be left for you. If changes are necessary, please make them and mail the Enumeration Notice, as soon as possible, in the self addressed postage prepaid envelope accompanying the Notice. For any additional information, please contact the local assessment office.
