### CVCA closing dates

The closing dates have been set for the conservation areas in the Credit Valley Conservation Authority. At Terra Cotta Conservation Area, the pool will be closing on Labour Day. There will be camping on weekends until September 16, and the area will be open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. while staff are working there. If weather permits, and there is sufficient demand, the park will be open until Thanksgiving for picnics and hiking. Winter activities will begin with sufficient snow.

### Pony is a champ

A Welsh pony, Asgard's Melisande, belonging to Mary Cork of Terra Cotta was chosen the junior champion filly in the Breeding Horse section of the CNE's horse show. The judging was held August 20.

### Parade preparations

The town's general committee has sanctioned the use of a selected route for the Georgetown Lion's Club's 94th annual Santa Claus parade, to be held this year on December 1. With regional approval already granted for the use of Maple Avenue and Main Street, the town was required Monday night to approve the remainder of the route from Moore Park plaza and along Main and Maple, Highway 7 and Mountainview Road.

### Shine On Bill wins

Mountainview Farms, added another chapter to its continuing success story as a horse-breeding operation last week when Shine On Bill, a registered thoroughbred yearling, came home from the CNE with second place honors in his class and fourth place in the registered Canadian hunter class. Bred by Hon Lister and shown by Stephen Lister, Shine On Bill was sired by Shine Sun, who, with Oil Capital and Man O' War among his forebears, continues to produce quality show and running horses. Shine Sun stood at Mountainview Farms for many years.

### Dogs kill sheep

The killing of six sheep on a local farm by dogs running at large has prompted the victimized farmers to contact The Herald in the hope of alerting the owners of the dogs that they must be responsible for their pets. A dog attack early Saturday morning at the Tenth Line farm of Brigadier and Mrs. F.C. Wallace left six breeding ewes dead and four more injured. Though awakened by the noise of the attack, the Wallaces were too late to stop the predators. Their predicament is typical of the cases which come briefly before town council on an almost weekly basis, in which livestock farmers around the area lay claim to provincial reimbursement because of such attacks by wolves, prairie coyotes of, in most cases, domesticated dogs.

### Board, caretakers settle

The Halton board of education has approved a one-year agreement with its 218 caretakers which will cost the board an increase of 7.8 per cent over last year's contract. The board approved without comment the proposal, which calls for a two-part salary increase totalling 55 cents an hour, a dental plan with 75 per cent of the premium to be paid by the board, and a holiday schedule revision which would mean four weeks holidays after 11 years' service. Total cost of the package is \$3,007,312, an increase of 7.8 per cent over last year's contract.

## Police beat

# Break and enters plague Halton

Halton Regional Police had to contend with a rash of break and enters this past week, with house, cars and businesses being equally popular targets. An Acton home was broken into, and an unknown amount of small change was stolen from a piggy bank. An old "Mansfield" camera valued at \$40 was also taken. The burglars gained access by way of a rear window.

Another Acton residence was broken into and assorted bottles of liquor and beer valued at \$40 were stolen. The burglars got into the house by a rear door. Vandals splashed white paint over the rear doors and walls of George Kennedy Public School. A Georgetown resident reported that prowlers had been seen in the vicinity of his home, throwing stones at the house and leaving obscene messages.

**COINS STOLEN**  
An Acton resident reported

that his home had been broken into, and assorted coins valued at about \$50 had been taken. Burglars broke into the Acton arena through a window in the ladies' washroom. They used a sledgehammer to get into the manager's office. They stole assorted cartons of cigarettes valued at \$75.

E and R Products reported the theft of a cedar picnic table valued at \$25.

Four trucks belonging to Sheridan Nurseries were damaged by vandals. Damage is estimated at \$115.

A mini-bike valued at \$250 was stolen from a residence on RR1, Norval.

A local firm reported the theft of four 45-gallon drums of used oil. The value of the stolen property is estimated at \$90.

A juvenile has been detained in connection with the theft of a 36-inch bicycle chain.

Damage was estimated at \$150 when vandals damaged the rear fender of a 1978 Honda

parked in the parking lot at the GO Train station. A 1976 Honda parked in the lot at the same time was damaged in the same fashion. Damage was estimated at \$100.

A Main Street South resident reported the theft of a men's bike and a canoe with a total value of \$490. The property was stolen during a burglary while the owner was on holiday.

A number of Bell Telephone cables were cut in the vicinity of Allen Road and also in the area of the 8th Line and 5 Sideroad.

A car parked at a residence on the 9th Concession was broken into and a cassette deck and two speakers stolen. Value of the missing property is estimated at \$475.

A man has been charged after some cases of beer were stolen from the Dominion Hotel property.

Burglars broke into a car parked on Edith Street and stole a baseball glove and 15 cassette tapes with a total value of \$180.

A cassette deck and assorted tapes were stolen from a car parked on Cleveholm Drive. Value of the property is estimated at \$180.

**CARBREAK-IN**

A break-in into a car on John Street netted burglars an AM-FM radio and cassette deck, a Pentax camera and a variety of lenses. Value of the property is estimated at \$911.

Three bedrooms were ransacked, and \$50 to \$100 kept in a piggy bank was stolen, in a burglary in an Acton home.

Nothing appears to be missing following a break-in at the Acton Curling Club.

Burglars appear to have stolen 12 tires, valued at \$680, during a break-in at the Canadian Tire Warehouse in Acton.

A number of antiques were stolen during a break-in at the shack being used by Westfront Productions in the filming of the movie, Never Trust An Honest Thief. Value of the missing property has not been established.

Vandals broke into Robert Little School in Acton by breaking a window. Once inside they broke two other windows.

Burglars stole a case and a half of Coca-Cola from the fridge in the Acton Scout Hall, after damaging a number of locks and doors.

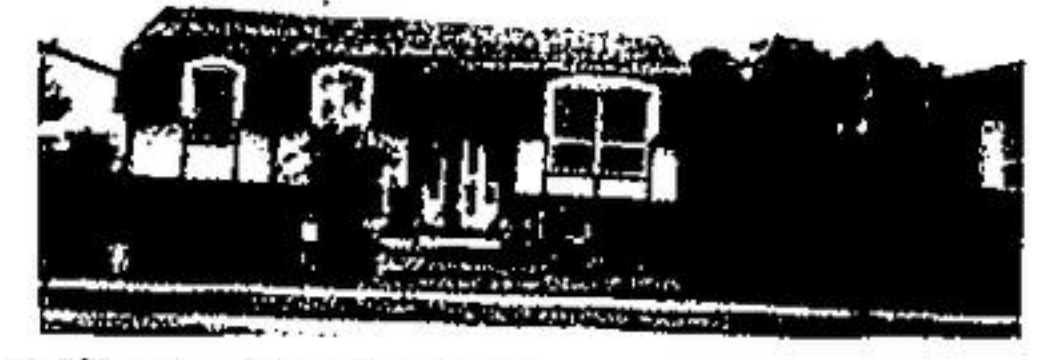

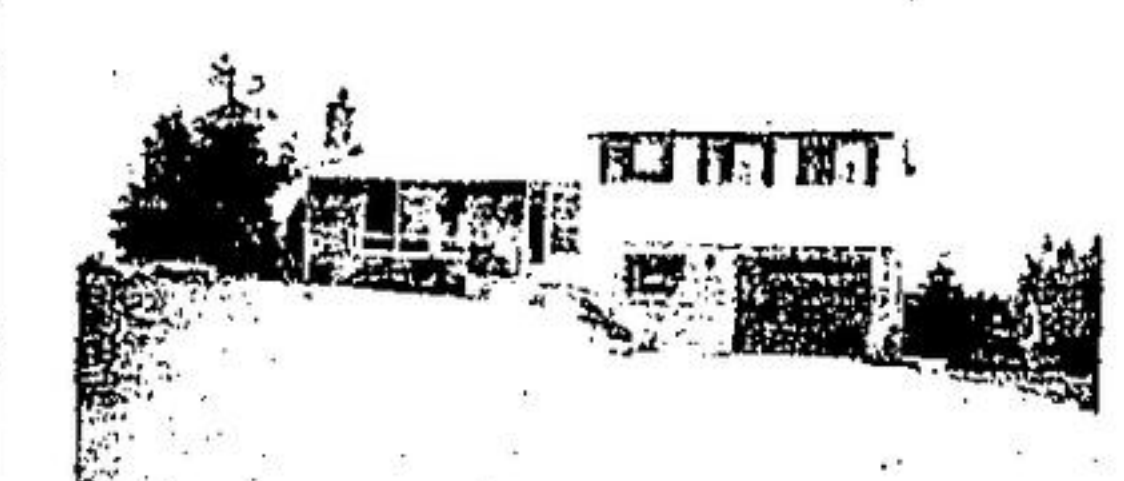

## Council endorses Oakville motion

Upon receipt of the additional information requested, the town's general committee endorsed a city of Oakville resolution Monday night aimed at restricting the area of operation for taxis licensed to operate in the vicinity of Toronto International Airport. Recommending a decision that had been delayed the week previous by confusion over the intent of Oakville's resolution, the committee advised council to join other municipalities in asking the federal government to enact legislation so that specially-licensed airport taxis can operate only in the area municipalities for which they carry a regular cab licence.

As explained by an Oakville official in a letter to Halton Hills, the resolution being circulated throughout southern Ontario was prompted by the practice of taxis from outside Oakville dropping off fares from the airport in Oakville and then picking up new fares to take them elsewhere.

**NO TAXIS**  
"At the moment, no Oakville taxis are licensed for airport service," Halton Hills clerk-administrator Ken Richardson explained, "which means that Oakville taxis can deliver passengers to the airport only. Taxis licensed by another municipality and the airport (e.g., Mississauga) may at present pick fares up in Oakville and deliver them to the airport, or upon delivery of a fare from the airport, pick another fare up and deliver it outside the municipality if the fare called the taxi."

"The intent of the resolution is to limit the pick up in Oakville to only Oakville licensed taxis, whether called by the public or not."

The committee endorsed the resolution without comment.
