Labor leader discusses 1980

A local labor leader forecast possible post office strike this fall during an interview Friday in which he criticized the new federal government and painted a bleak picture of the local labor scene the past year.

"We've had our problems in this area in the last year," Holland Marshall, president of the Brampton and District Labor Council, which includes Georgetown, said. "It hasn't been a good year."

Mr. Marshall said while unemployment has steadied over the past few years, it hasn't improved. "Unemployment is still too high," he said.

While more small factories are opening, larger ones are laying workers off and the auto industry has been hit hard

which affects this area, he said.

Even at Mr. Marshall's employer, Northern Telecom, employment has never returned to the level it was prior to layoffs in the spring of 1978 and "it's doubtful we ever will," he said.

TRANSIT STRIKE

Also cited was the lengthy city transit strike and the 17-week old strike at Ralph-Clark-Stone Ltd in Bramalea which is "no closer to getting a settlement than before," Mr. Marshall said.

Inflation has not been kept in check despite the promise of the previous federal government, he said.

Despite fears, wage settlements have not got out of hand since wage controls were lifted, he said.

Nationally, settlements have averaged between six and eight per cent increases, he said, while inflation has been rising at nine to 10 per cent.

Mr. Marshall said the previous federal government simply postponed for a year or so postal problems when it ordered employees back to work last fall.

"They didn't really solve a damn thing," he said. "I'm very concerned about negotiations in the post office this fall."

Mr. Marshall also foresees future problems between the new federal Conservative government and labor.

LOWEST RING

That translates into people on the lowest rung of the economic ladder being hurt the most, he said.

The labor council, made up of representatives of unions representing more than 10,000 workers in Peel and part of Halton, is still operating a full employment committee, Mr. Marshall said.
