

Pitchers dominate

Glen Williams split playoff games

Pitching told the tale as Glen Williams and Hespeler split the first two games of their best of three inter-county fastball quarter final lead by strong performances by their hurlers.

The Glen men took the first game with a 5-0 win Tuesday night at home. Friday night Hespeler came back with a 3-0 victory on their home diamond.

Jeff Haines lead the way

Tuesday night in the Glen pitching what team manager John Haines termed "a super game".

Haines pitched 13 strikeouts, eight of them consecutive as he struckout eight of the nine first batters.

Hespeler batters didn't get to Haines until the eight inning second baseman Ken Craig cracked out a triple.

Craig would go on to star at the bat in Friday's win.

Glen Williams managed six hits in their win and committed no errors. Errors were to haunt Hespeler as they played a part in two Glen runs.

Glen Williams' Danny Fields got on base in the seventh with an error and was moved over to second on a sacrifice by Rod

Beaumont. Burt Osborne brought Fields home with a single.

Glen Williams picked up four of their runs in the sixth with Osborne, Rob Hatcher, Glen Fendley and, helping his own cause, Jeff Haines all crossing the plate for a run.

The team chipped away at Hespeler's starting pitcher Bill Hahn with consecutive singles to pick up the runs.

Glen Williams stymied Hespeler, lead by their overpowering pitching and it looked like a short series.

REVERSE FRIDAY

"But it was just the reverse Friday", said manager Haines. Glen Williams was out-hit by Hespeler 5-3 in their 3-0 loss.

"We ran into a strong pitcher who we'd never faced before", said Haines referring to Hespeler's Larry Griffin.

However, unlike Haines in the first game, Griffin tallied few strikeouts. Haines said he would be worried if Griffin had picked up strikeouts but the pitcher counted on a lot of

groundballs to beat the Glen and, according to Haines "it's just a matter of finding the holes."

The Glen was in trouble many times during the game but worked their way out. Hespeler left a lot of men on base throughout the game.

Terry Haines went the distance to pick up the loss for the Glen.

As the teams prepared for last night's (Tuesday) final game in Glen Williams, Haines said he was happy to have the home park advantage.

"I wouldn't want to have to go up there for the third game. We've had trouble

He added Haines has been pitching "awfully well" lately and hoped for a strong outing.

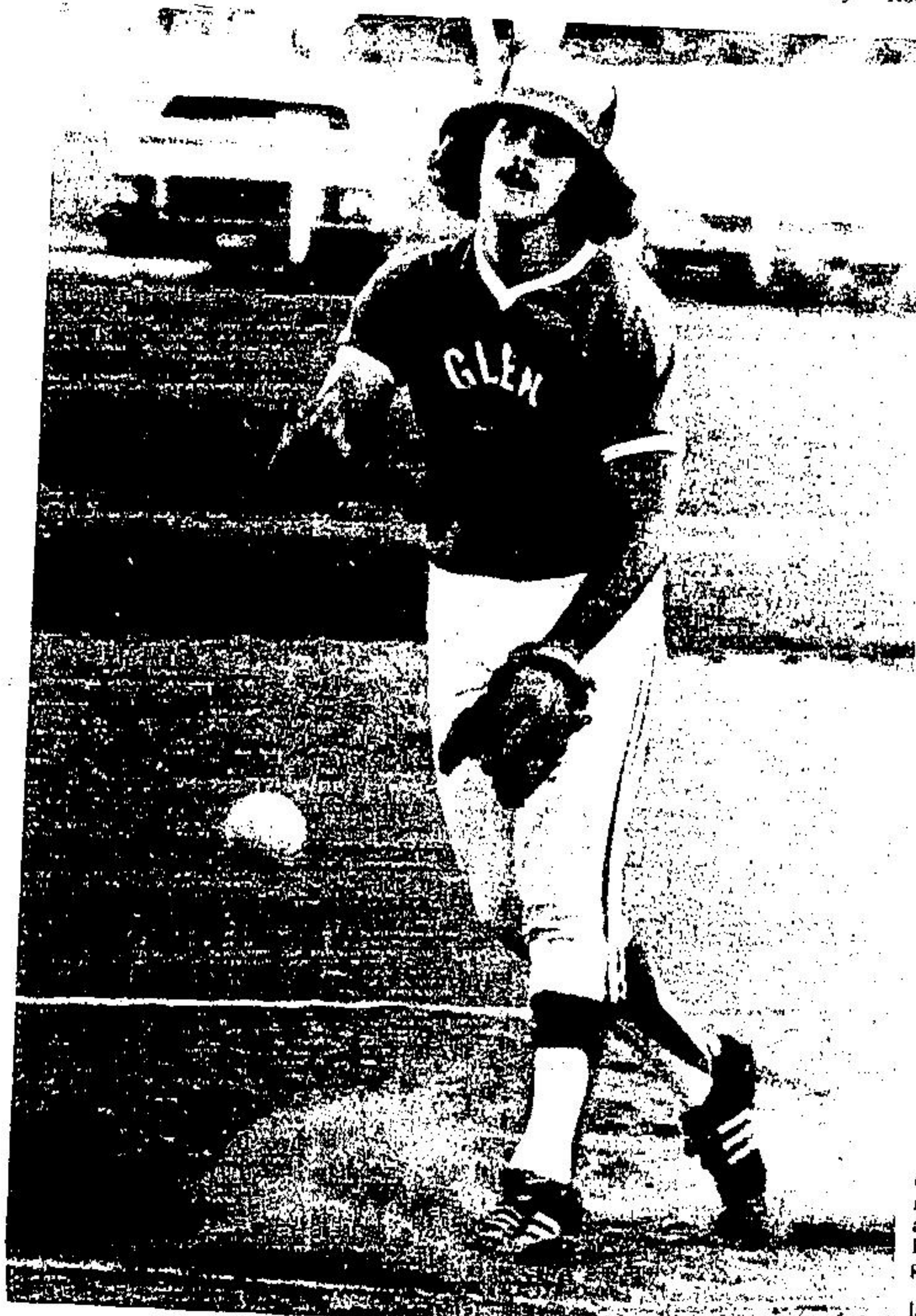
Royals hammer Oshawa
