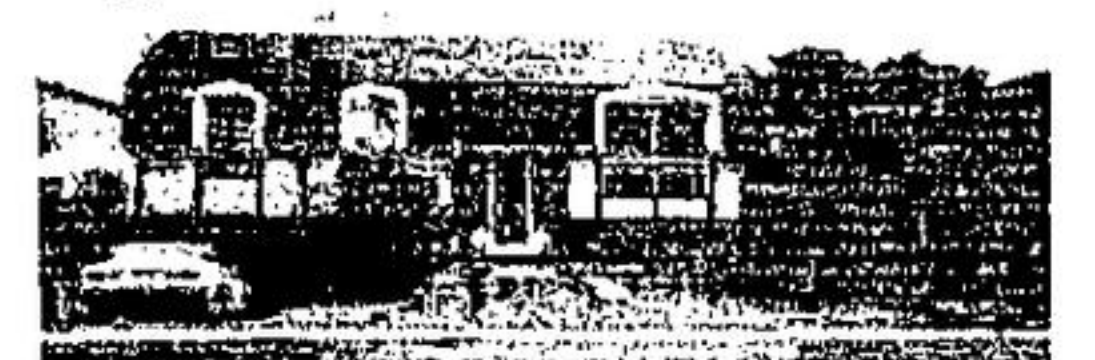

Now that funding for Christopher King's oxygen supply seems assured the Georgetown Kinsmen have decided to turn their Christopher Fund into an emergency medical fund.

"Because the King family ran into problems, we think there are probably other local people with medical financing problems from time to time," said Kinsmen Bob Malcolmson who spearheaded the original Christopher Fund.

"We will keep the fund in existence to handle similar

medical problems in the future."

Mr. Malcolmson said the Kinsmen will approach local organizations, such as the Red Cross and ask them to determine who should qualify for assistance from the fund.

Donations can be sent care of the fund to the Toronto-Dominion Bank in the Halton Hills Shopping Centre or to Box 24, Georgetown, Ontario.

"We hope other money raised to help Christopher will be donated to this fund," said Mr Malcolmson.
