

Region's landfilling costs may soar

A lack of cover material and the need for an eight-month extension of the operator's contract at the Oakville landfill site may see Halton taxpayers contribute another \$130,000 to the overall cost of current landfilling operations.

The region's public works committee last week authorized a \$129,300 hike in Halton's 1979 operating budget to cover the additional cost of operations and maintenance at the Oakville site, to which all Halton Hills and Milton solid waste will be trucked following the closure of Georgetown's own landfill site next month.

A slowdown in the construction industry was blamed for the shortage of topsoil fill which was readily available

until last year to Environmental Quality Handling Ltd., the firm contracted by the region to operate the Oakville site.

TOPSOIL PURCHASE

As a result, the region must purchase the six inches of topsoil cover needed at the site every day, estimated to cost a total of \$123,000 for the full year ending December 31.

Partially in response to the concerns of neighboring property owners, the region will be buying more than the anticipated amount of final soil cover. The estimated cost of importing a two-foot layer of soil and then seeding the site once landfilling has ended is \$44,400.

With litter control another major concern, the region will make special maintenance.

provisions through an \$11,900 expenditure.

The overall costs of soil cover and litter pick-up totals \$179,300, but was reduced to \$129,300 after the committee agreed that an extension of the site's leachate collection system is both unnecessary and impractical this year. The site is to be expanded for use by the entire region next year while legal wrangles continue over the region's plans to establish a 246-acre dump in rural Milton.

Also helping to boost costs at the Oakville site is the additional charge demanded by the

contractor, who operated the site at a rate of \$2.15 a ton during the actual contract period. Since renewal of the contract through tendering was deemed impractical, an extension to the existing contract, which expired August 31, was negotiated at a new rate of \$2.75 per ton.

Noting that \$50,000 will still have to be spent next year on the leachate system, Burlington Councillor Joan Allingham complained that the region has budgeted itself \$179,300 short for landfilling. Continuing operations at the Burlington site, she added, will cost another \$160,000.

"I just don't think that's acceptable," she said. "Here's \$12,000 spent at Oakville just picking up scraps."

NOT ACCEPTABLE

Commenting that it is "no longer easy" to get fill for use as daily cover at the sites, committee chairman Ron Planche of Oakville suggested that Halton's area municipalities should be requested to

have construction firms hired by them haul their unneeded fill to Oakville as a condition of the contract.

Don Morrier of the public works staff assured the committee that the figures recommended for adoption represent "the bleakest picture" in terms of costs. The situation could prove to be much better and less expensive, he said.
