Jack Raftis breaks tie vote to push uniform sewer rate

resident with an average assessment and normal household consumption of 66,000 gallons of water a year will pay an annual sewer and water bill of \$190 by 1983.

Under the existing system, however, in which each of the area municipalities covers its own sewer and water costs, the same resident would be paying \$175 in Burlington and Milton, \$185 in Oakville and as much as \$300 in Halton Hills.

Last week, Mayor Bird had the support of all other Burlington representatives and most Milton councillors when he contended that the uniform rates would cost his city nearly \$263,000 next year, while Acton would "gain" more than \$685,000.

Other calculations made by Mayor Bird for the initial cost of implementing uniform rates suggest that Milton will similarly lose nearly \$48,000 in 1980, while Oakville would gain about \$522,000 and Georgetown would gain \$445,000.

BALANCE COSTS
Mr. Farmer's proposal for

allocating provincial grants in such a way to benefit all four municipalities equally seeks to balance costs and deficits across the region by 1983, by which time Burlington and Milton will supposedly have "drawn even" with Halton Hills and Oakville.

Milton Mayor Don Gordon, as equally outspoken as his Burlington counterpart, claimed that residents of his municipality will have to contribute more than \$733,000 to regional water and sewer accounts under the new system.

Mayor Gordon endorsed Mayor Bird's recommendation that a decision on the new rate policy should be deferred until an independent consultant could examine the proposed system for possible inequities among the municipalities.

In strenuously opposing the

equalization of servicing rates, Mayor Bird was following the precedent set during regional council's last term by his predecessor, Mary Munro. The city's former mayor met with easy success, however, leading a majority of council members in opposing the move.

lating industrial subdivisions, or "regional business parks", the policy states, where acquisition could provide for "more aggressive marketing of a municipal location", provide a balance of suitable land among the area municipalities, ensure that at least a third of the land in question is available to "non-developer", ensure that land prices are competitive with those of neighboring regions and to open up new industrial or special interests areas beyond the needs of the private sector.

Specific proposals for the acquisition of industrial lands will be the subject of a confidential recommendation from the region's Department of Business Development, according to the policy. Council members will thus be informed of whatever steps have been taken to resolve outstanding development problems through the private sector.

At council's direction, the land in question would then be

evaluated by an independent appraiser, and if its acquisition is subsequently approved, will be purchased and serviced using the region's operating funds or its profits from land sales. If the purchasing cost is "significant", however, it will be financed through the issuance of debentures not to exceed a seven-year period.

The policy also contains specific directions for the purchase and development of regional business parks.
