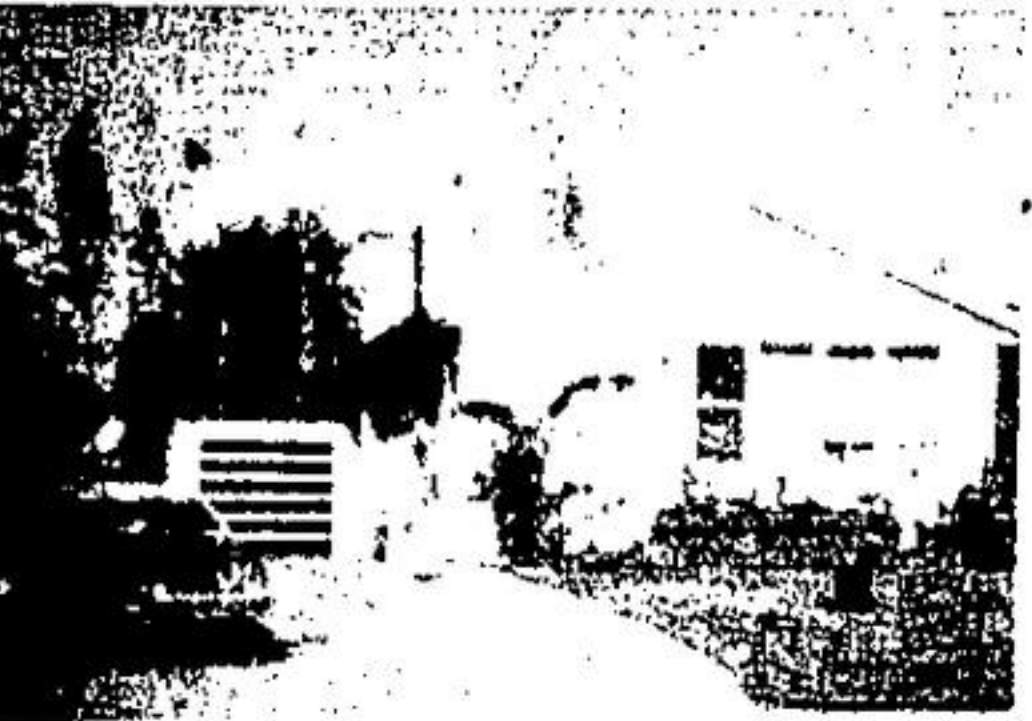

"When it first began here all the soccer players were British.
