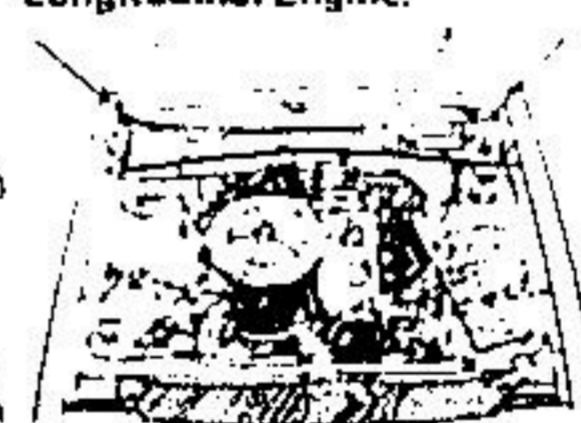

Front Wheel Drive.

Longitudinal Engine.



In designing Tercel with a fore and aft (longitudinal) engine, Toyota has created a powerplant which is exceptionally easy to service. This ease of access will help keep the cost of operating your new Tercel to a minimum.

And yet, Tercel's engine takes up no more room than a transverse. This remarkable system places the differential underneath the engine rather than behind it.

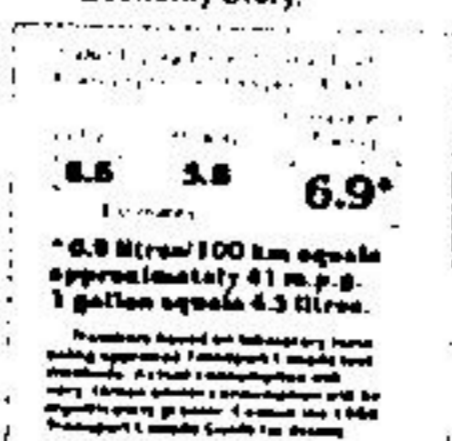
4-Wheel Independent Suspension.

For years racing cars have used 4-wheel independent suspension. Naturally Tercel has 4-wheel independent suspension with MacPherson front strut and pure trailing rear arms. There are stabilizer bars both front and rear. To improve steering stability and brake efficiency, to reduce to a minimum snatching and torque steering, Toyota has ingeniously employed slightly positive - offset kingpin geometry on Tercel. This shock transmitted from the road to the steering wheel is efficiently suppressed and steering balance is maintained.

The four Tercel models (Sedan, Sedan TG, Liftback and SR5 Liftback) require very little by way of options.

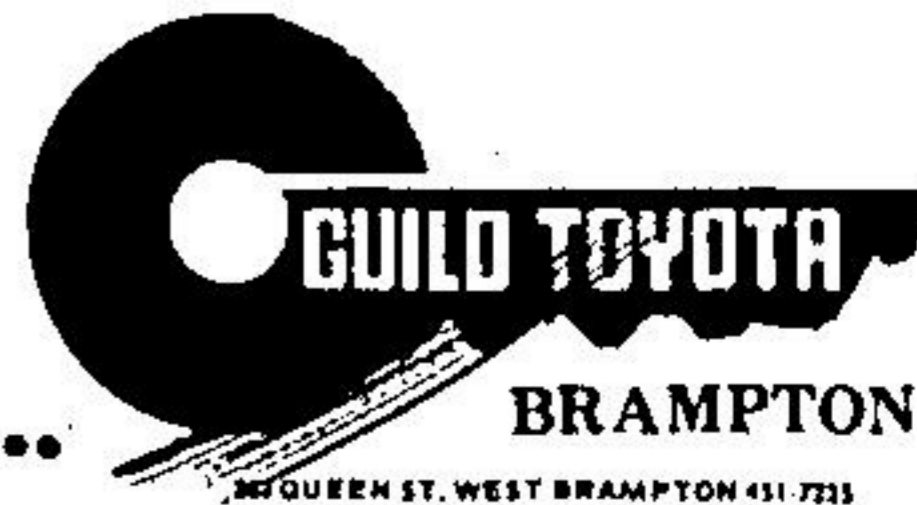
