Bus route concern

To the editor of the Herald: With regards to the proposed bus route through George-

petition was recently drawn up by a group of concerned residents of the Marywood Meadows subdivision seeking to ban the routing of the bus through that area abd a meeting was subsequently held with the General Committee of Council at Halton Hills Town Offices on Monday. 29 October.

The gentleman collecting signatures for this petition was courteous and unruffled when I hesitated to sign, firstly for personal reasons which I gave him and secondly because of the obvious value of the service to the Senior Citizens on Park Street. I also pointed out that since there was to be a bus route many others would be equally inconvenienced.

·He indicated that on the proposed rerouting the bus would still stop at the Medical Centre, thus serving the Senior Citizens, and that on the presently proposed route there was an area on Mary Street where the bus would be required to back up - a practice I do

disagree with. For this reason I signed the petition.

However, it has come to my attention that during the meeting the names of those not signing the petition were revealed along with the names and reasons for those who were initially hesitant but did sign - an action which could only be designed to create ill-feeling. What I had to say was personal and, I assumed, confidential. And what did it matter? I had signed any-

I do not believe it is the business of anyone as to who signed and who did not, or why. Nor should conversation with the petitioner be broadeast. Signing a petition, or not signing is an individual's choice and the matter should be limited to a formal list of signatures of those in favour of an objection for presentation to Council; not as a potential tool for muckraking.
