Glad so many appreciated the recipe for Jerky and Permican in last week's Ontario Outdoors. I know that you will enjoy this energy food, especially in conjunction with dried fruits on the trail.  
Game dinners should be, and often are, a celebration of the many things that nature can provide. When cooking game why not emphasize the pleasure derived from your association with the outdoors as well as the fine taste of the foods. Decorate the table with an eye to nature, and serve a variety of wild foods and meats at the same time. With this in mind, why not stock your fish and game for a real feast to which you can invite your friends and share with them the many pleasures to be found in our out-of-doors. In the near future I will provide some of the ways in which this may be accomplished with flair and much pride, so get stocking up on game and fish and watch this column. This goes for wives as well as husbands, even though many men leave it all for the wife to cook, there are a great many men that won't even allow their wives into the kitchen when they cook game dinners.

**FALL TROUT FISHING**  
Sure are a lot of ducks around for this time of year. I guess this follows with the good weather I predicted, and the fishing is still excellent. Plenty of Muskie are being taken in such places as Honey Harbour and other places where the Muskie season is open. Fall trout fishing is also tops right now and the weather is still not cold (at least for the hardy) and the fish plentiful and active. **Book review**

**'Radio Comedy' recalls Golden Age**

Today's young radio listener might find it hard to believe, but there really was a Golden Age of Radio—and particularly of radio comedy.  
It's all chronicled in a new book titled Radio Comedy, by Arthur Frank Wertheim (Oxford University Press, 395 pages, \$25.25), a writer whose capacity for thorough research more than compensates for the occasionally stilted style of writing he reveals.  
Wertheim traces the development of radio comedy from The Happiness Boys (1926) and Sam 'n' Harry (the names Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll used before switching to Amos 'n' Andy) down to the Charlie McCarthy Show in 1956, the last radio network comedy show of any note.  
In between, you learn about Vic and Sade, Fibber McGee and Molly, Ed Wynn, Eddie Cantor, Joe Penner, Burns and Allen, Stoopnagle and Budd, The Easy Aces and many more radio comedy stars.  
ALL IN FUN  
Happily, considerable space is devoted to the two major radio comedians of that era, Jack Benny and Fred Allen. Their careers are outlined, their styles analyzed and their quips quoted. The author gives us some stories about Allen's famous clashes with network executives, particularly over the matter of censorship.  
Indeed, one of the attractions of Wertheim's book is the liberal sprinkling of excerpts from the scripts of many of the radio comedians he writes about.  
These excerpts are not, generally, merely dropped into the book. In most cases, some background is given so that the reader gets not only a sample of the funny routine but a grasp of the style and approach of the particular comedian.  
Some coverage is given, also to the various feuds the radio stars conducted—all in fun, of course, and good for publicity. Jack Benny and Fred Allen carried on a long on-air feud, as did Walter Winchell and Ben Bernie, W.C. Fields and Charlie McCarthy, and Bing Crosby and Bob Hope.  
ADVENT OF TV  
In addition, Wertheim provides some information on the birth, development and eventual demise of radio comedy (the last due largely to the advent of television) so that the reader can better understand the role of the networks in first supporting and later exploiting this form of entertainment.  
The author also records the role of the sponsors in shaping and directing the course of radio—a role the sponsors later repented in television.  
If there is a serious flaw in the book it is when the author tries to get serious. Wertheim makes an unconvincing attempt to place radio comedy in a kind of sociological context, arguing that the success of radio comedy was due largely to The Great Depression (his caps, not mine).
