The banquet was held Thursday at the Legion Hall, with the dinner being provided by the Legion Auxiliary. The program featured the awards presentation, with remarks made by several of the guests, including Col. Al Johnson, who

is in charge of the air cadets in this region, and concluded with a film.

The featured presentation of the evening, in addition to the awards, was a presentation to Colin Cousins, who was twice commanding officer of the air cadets, and twice the chairman of the Legion sponsoring committee for the air cadets.
